

Adventure Balloons soar

Over recent years, Mid Canterbury has not had the enormous pleasure of seeing majestic hot-air balloons aloft in our skies.

Thankfully, that has changed! Graeme Church (not the Graeme Church from Ashburton), who had previously piloted balloons with Aoraki Balloon Safari's has come back to New Zealand and set up a new business, Adventure Balloons New Zealand, based right here in Methven.

Balloon pilots tend to follow the weather and go from season to season, (a bit like the ski industry), and Graeme has over thirty years experience in the industry having run ballooning companies Pendle and Cumbria in the United Kingdom. A number of years ago when not flying during the UK winter, Graeme answered an advertisement placed by George Currie needing a balloon pilot here in Methven, and from there a long friendship started.

There are only four balloon operators in New Zealand; one in Hamilton, Darfield, Methven and Queenstown. Graeme has been asked to be an examiner for the Civil Aviation Authority with ASPEQ (they organise the assessments for aviation examinations) for ballooning.

Graeme is also starting a ballooning school and with that in mind, brought out 77 balloons from the UK for teaching purposes. To gain your Balloon Flying Qualification, you need a minimum of 16 hours flying time. Our weather in New Zealand is really conducive for balloons, giving us the opportunity to fly year round.

For an experience with Adventure Balloons New Zealand, you need to allow up to four hours. You will receive the full package from preparing the balloon for flight and inflation to putting it away afterwards. Each flight lasts for about an hour and is a very unique experience. The take-off/launch is from pre-arranged locations, and Adventure Balloons have paddocks and

landing spots available to them in the area. There is a definite magic about ballooning that has come a long way from Leonardo da Vinci's ideas.

George said, "You fly with the breeze, don't know where you're going, don't know where you're going to land, and don't know who you're going to meet when you get there."

Extra crew follow in a chase vehicle, and when the balloon lands, passenger can celebrate with a glass of champagne.

Mt Hutt ready to open at Alert

Mt Hutt is ready to open with a little more normalcy this Friday 12 June after New Zealand moved into Alert Level 1 this week.

NZSki CEO Paul Anderson says the team at Mt Hutt have welcomed the news and are stoked to be opening this weekend

"Level 1 looks like a little more of a normal season for us operationally. We won't have to manage physical distancing in lift queues or on chairlifts, and it gives our food and beverage more flexibility in their offering.

"At Mt Hutt it means we can run at capacity with around 3500 people on the slopes, rather than half of that under Level 2. With this, we can now confirm we will be open daily from 1st July once we have increased our staff numbers to allow us to operate with more people on the mountain."

At Coronet Peak and The Remarkables, planned opening days and hours will largely stay the same at level 1 unless demand increases. However, Anderson confirms The Remarkables season will be extended to open daily during the October school holidays, with a new scheduled closing

date of Sunday 11 October.

"Australians make up 30-40% of our visitation in Queenstown so we're still expecting a quieter season. If demand requires it or a trans-Tasman bubble opened up then we do have the ability to scale up our operations.

"Across all three mountains we will still be implementing enhanced hygiene standards, encouraging guests to check-in with the government Covid-19 app and have the ability to contact trace through our lift passes and RFID scanners," Anderson says.

To encourage more Kiwis to give snowsports a go this winter, the company is offering up a few new deals including extending their Earlybird multi-day lift pass sale, 10% off when you book online, upgrading day passes to a 'Queenstown Superpass' and extending the 'Kids under 10 Ski Free' deal to all three mountains.

To celebrate moving to Level 1, the company is running their Earlybird multi-day pass sale through until Monday 15 June, giving people the opportunity to ski or board for less than \$75 a day.

Day lift passes will be automatically upgraded to a Queenstown Superpass, giving guests more flexibility on days they decide not to ski and the ability to use part of the cost of their lift pass as credit for activities or dining around Queenstown.

To encourage guests to book online all lift passes and snowsports products will have 10% off.






A massive load of work happened up at the Mount Hutt Bike trails over the weekend.





Physiotherapy and Concussion

In the clinic we often meet clients who have sustained mild to moderate concussion without it being picked up in the first instance. Sometimes they were part of a major event, and the saving of life or limb takes priority. On other occasions it "didn't seem that bad" only to find they are having problems later on.

Here at Contact Physiotherapy I do not have the specialist skills to manage full on concussive symptoms so my role may just be to advise specialist services in Christchurch. For the less severe or recovering concussion we can assist in understanding the condition and assisting in self-management strategies.

Physical examination can include assessment of the neck, dizziness/inner ear, headaches, balance, exercise tolerance and physical control and function. Some respond to

manual therapy and others require pacing of activity and a slow gradual exposure to stimuli.

The psychological considerations should not be treated lightly. A reduction in mental processing can be stressful to the client and those around him/her who may not understand the changes. A positive support system is a critical component of recovery at work and at home. A history of mental health problems or substance abuse make recovery that bit more challenging.

It cannot be over emphasised how valuable the person's understanding of recovery, enabling a positive outlook and providing resources and equipment for recovery can be. Again, creating a cohesive approach at home, school/work and on the sports field is critical.

Important considerations are relative restwithin the limit of your symptoms, sleep, paced return to activity, regular reviews with the medical team and sharing the symptoms, limitations and goals with family and carers all combine to promote good recovery.

Evidence indicates that physiotherapy after concussion is safe and starting early may facilitate a faster recovery. Specialist review is particularly indicated in clients who have experienced migraine/chronic headaches, changes in sight or hearing, sleep reduction, mental health problems or altered processing of information.

If you have experienced concussion please don't be afraid to seek support to improve the physical, mental or emotional components

Our "germ art"


This past week The Year 2/3's from Piwakawaka GT and L, have been creating their own "germ art."

Hitting the ground running

Football is ever changing worldwide, and Methven is no different, ringing in the changes every year including at management level.

We've heard names branded 'the wally with the brolly' and 'the clown with the frown' but now Methven have their very own Instructor with the muster in the shape of Marc Davies at the helm. In his first competitive game in charge, the mountaineers welcomed F.C Twenty 11 Falcons to town. With some new ideas and new belief, our boys got down to work.

A highly disciplined approach from the off was the formula and the home sides structured formation was leaving the visitors frustrated and lacking ideas how to penetrate the defence. Despite this Methven dodged the bullet early on when veteran Keeper, James Wasley was forced into action, coming to the rescue and saving a one on one, admirably and sparing his side of any blushes.

An instant reply from the Mountaineers, straight from the kick off, saw Luccini again whip a ball into Cameron running on and deft touching the ball majestically into the corner of the net, 2-1.

A deserved lead as they went into the break and the second half was

going to be much of the same with a controlled and rigid formation, only this time they added more conviction to their attacks. Cameron returned the favour, chipping a beautiful ball to the back post to be met by the head of the approaching Jan Luccini, 3-1. After a series of corners and the home side well and truly pinning the Falcons in, there was to be more hurt applied in the shape of Tommy Leek, plunging his header beyond the washed up keeper and defender on the line, courtesy of yet another Luccini, in swinger, 4-1.

Unfortunately, the visitors would strike again with the goal of the game and keeper Wasley was left helpless as a delightful effort curled into the top corner from outside the area, 6-3.

Galbraith would have the final say of the afternoon; poaching in to leave egg on the face of the keeper, hitting left pegged into the inside of the net. Final score 7-3, a fantastic return to form for the boys and they will be in action again, next Saturday, when they take a trip to Centennial Park to face CTFC Sweaters.

Accelerating our Tourism Offering

Andrew Falloon MP for Rangitata





With borders closed for the foreseeable future, the tourism sector was always going to be one of the hardest hit industries in the wake of COVID-19.

Many of our local tourist markets and many thousands of small businesses rely on international tourists coming in and filling our skifields, our hotels and motels, our retailers, our bars, restaurants and cafes.

Although there have been, and will continue to be, some high profile business casualties, the response so far from New Zealanders has been impressive. In recent days I've spent a fair bit of time talking to accommodation providers across the country, and some have reasons for optimism. In many cases bookings by Kiwis are up, with forward reservations for July making those in May and June look like a rounding error.

With locals unable to travel overseas, I hope that can be sustained. Although never replacing what we've lost in international arrivals, Kiwis getting about and seeing their own backyard represents an opportunity for them, and a lifeline for struggling tourism operators.

Beyond that, the opening of a Trans-Tasman bubble with Australia has enormous merit.

Provided both countries can demonstrate they have control of the virus, an exclusive travelling relationship between us and our Aussie mates should be a priority as soon as it's safe to do so. International tourism has been an important and growing market for us for many years, and it can be again. What's needed in many parts of the country is further investment in that.

Rather than putting our eggs exclusively in the Queenstown and Rotorua baskets, as much encouragement as possible should be made to broaden out our tourism offerings. Recently National leader Todd Muller put forward a recommendation to Government that would do exactly that. Known as the Tourism Accelerator, it would provide up to \$100 million to co-fund projects with tourism operators aimed at growing new tourism offerings across the country.

For some communities that might be new cycle trails, pushing further into a growing worldwide market of fitness-leisure. For others it might be high-end luxury services, giving other towns and cities the opportunity to replicate the success of a previously oversaturated Queenstown market.

Some have suggested now is the time to pull back on marketing ourselves as a tourism destination. In difficult financial times it's a natural reaction. But it risks us being left behind as the world's most desired destination.

One of the biggest dangers in circumstances like we've seen in recent months is disruption. Short term habits become longer term, and become set as the new normal. Rather than pulling back, the alternative is to forcefully step forward, putting ourselves up as the preeminent destination for travellers when it is safe to do so.

Others around the world are gearing up for it, and it's important for the many businesses and jobs that rely on tourism that we do too.
