



Friday 7 June marked a huge milestone in the progress of music at Mount Hutt College with the school's choir making a fantastic return to New Zealand's premier choral festival, The Big Sing.

The MHC Chorus, made up of 19 students from year 9 to 13, performed superbly well under the direction of Kath Woodley presenting three songs.

They began their programme with Douglas E. Wagner's A Quiet Sanctus following it with The Voices of Children, a wonderful composition by arguably New Zealand's foremost composer of choral music, David Hamilton. Then demonstrating a high level of contrast they closed their set with the up-beat barbershop classic, One Fine Day by Goffin and King.

In addition to presenting their own music the festival was an excellent opportunity to watch and learn from the myriad of other superb choirs with students developing a range of musicianship skills and leaving them extremely excited at the prospect of returning even stronger next year. In the awards ceremony the MHC Chorus was recognized in receiving the award for Outstanding Performance by a New Choir capping off a superb evening. The gala concert closed with an incredibly emotion massed performance (27 choirs) of Heemi Tuamutu's Wairua o te puna under the direction of Auckland University's Robert Wiremu.

The main theme of this piece is love and was presented to Christchurch as a gift recognizing the strength, love and compassion the city has shown in the wake of the terror attacks and as a way of welcoming everyone back to the Douglas Lilburn Auditorium within the Christchurch Town Hall after a 9 year absence.

You can actually change the circuitry of the brain to help you become more peaceful, calm and focused simply by directing your thoughts and attention.



Out of Africa

Life has returned to normal for the team that travelled recently to Malawi, Africa. There they helped on an aid and community development project with Christchurch based charity, Mphatikizo Cooperative. The memories are vivid and the feeling of enjoyment in helping others, lingers on.

The team of Methven locals travelled to Southern Malawi and stayed in a village called Mtubwi, near Liwonde. They stayed for approximately three weeks. Liwonde is a very poor area with people earning one NZ dollar per day, and hunger is not uncommon. The team experienced some of the issues first-hand with a week-long outage of the community water supply, diesel ran out in the local town for three days, and the district ran out of cash for 4 days with no money available from the local ATM's. Credit Cards aren't accepted so the group had to travel 45 minutes to get cash for living expenses.

The team youngster and Mount Hutt College student, Samantha Fitzgerald, really enjoyed her experience. "The poverty is obvious, but the children are so happy despite not having any things", she says. "They have no possessions, but they don't let that get them down. They push along bicycle wheel rims or a block of wood makes for a good cell phone. It was a good reminder of what is important



in life".

Sonya Adams spent a lot of her time interacting with women and children in the village. "Young women have a challenging life over there as marriage as young as 14 is not uncommon, and sometimes the men may have two or three wives. Talking with the girls and explaining that there are better options like staying at school and getting an education is really important", she says.

"The opportunity to help in tangible and practical ways has been very rewarding", says team leader Richard Fitzgerald. "We set out to build one house and re-roof other homes.

which we achieved. We also managed to do other things with the community like repair the community well, service the solar power system for the community centre and spend time with children and young women in the village." The team worked with builders and local village members and constructed a baked-mud brick house with a tin roof. The house was 5 x 6 m in size and will house three families.

"Agogo, who received the house, was so excited she started sleeping in the house when the brick walls were only half-way up. She would dance with excitement at the end of each day as she saw the progress. The

highlight for the team was the hand over to Agogo as she cried tears of joy at her new home. There wasn't a dry eye anywhere as we all realised how much it meant to her. She now has a roof over her head and all three families have a much better quality of life," says Mark Taylor, Pastor of the Mt Hutt Elim Church. "One of our aims was to be practical in our Christian faith, which is what we did, and it has made a big difference to that community. This is Christianity in action," says Mark.

Matt Adams, a forester back here in NZ, found himself brick laying, concreting, roofing, building, and not even the appearance of a Black Mamba snake, known to kill an

adult in 30 minutes if bitten, would dent his enthusiasm. Ruth and Rhys Fitzgerald both noted the variety of experiences they faced. "Some were confronting and disturbing, some were delightful and gave you warm fuzzies. Extreme poverty is not pretty but in amongst this the Malawian's are beautiful and so friendly. We have made some great friends and often think about them now were back home here." Megan is still in Malawi completing her Masters research.

From Agogo, Merci, Giblo and the people of Mtubwi Village; "thank you, thank you, thank you for your generosity; we are very grateful for these gifts."

The team also would like to thank the Methven Community for the well wishes and generous support for the re-roofing project. The money was well spent and has and will be making a difference in that community for a long time yet.

Vitamin D

We all think of getting our vitamin D when we are out in the sun, but what is its importance to health, and who is at risk of deficiency?

Vitamin D is not strictly a vitamin, but actually a prohormone that regulates serum calcium concentration by aiding the absorption of ingested dietary calcium in the bowel. If serum calcium levels are low, the body has to maintain adequate levels by mobilising stores from our bones. Therefore, Vitamin D's primary role is actually involved in bone health, whilst also helping to maintain a healthy immune system, glowing skin, and muscle integrity. Deficiency can result in increased bone turnover leading to reduced bone mineral density, more porous bones, and consequently an increased risk of fractures.

Suboptimal levels of Vitamin D are relatively common in the NZ population with an estimated 25% of us having serum levels below the optimal amount. Serious clinical deficiencies in adults can lead to a condition called osteomalacia (softening of the bones), also known as rickets in children.

Vitamin D is the only vitamin whereby we cannot meet our requirements from dietary intake alone. In fact there is very little in food sources. Small amounts can be found in oily fish (e.g. wild salmon, mackerel), products

fortified with vitamin D, and mushrooms. The main source is direct sunlight!

As we are now in the middle of winter in Methven, it is important between the months of May to August to try and get sun exposure each day. Around midday is best, with exposure to the face, hands and arms if temperatures allow! Sitting inside in the sun is counterproductive as the UVB required for the metabolic process of generating Vitamin D cannot occur. If you are at higher altitudes, such as skiing, ensure you wear sunscreen, and if you have a history of skin cancer, always wear sunscreen. As important as sun exposure is, being sun smart is crucial. So like most aspects of health, balance is key. Skin cancer is the most common cancer in NZ and too much exposure without adequate protection, particularly in the summer months, can be very damaging to the skin (and also leads to wrinkles!).

People at risk of vitamin D deficiency include:

- People who are predominantly indoors, e.g. work, long-stay hospitalisation, institutions.
- Heavy clothing e.g. religious reasons, colder temperatures.
- Locations further from the equator like NZ, particularly in the winter months. This is due to the solar zenith angle with the sun being further away due to the tilt

of the earth and this affects how much UV light reaches the earth's surface. Compared to Europe on equivalent latitudes, NZ has higher UV levels due to the lack of ozone layer. This is good news for vitamin D exposure in winter, but bad news for our skin cancer rates.

- People who avoid the sun e.g. history of skin cancer, photosensitising medications. fair skin.
- People with malabsorption syndromes.
 People consuming a low fat diet as vitamins A, D, E, and K are the 'fat-soluble' vitamins which can only be absorbed alongside dietary fat.
- Babies who are partially/exclusively breast fed by a mum who is deficient in Vitamin D.

If you are worried about deficiency, talk to your doctor.

Vitamin D definitely needs further research, but there is plenty of exciting work being undertaken, so watch this space!

Since it's the beginning of the ski season and dairy changeover I thought that I'd tell you a bit about what Playcentre is all about. Maybe you are new to town too, or maybe your circumstances have changed and your mornings are free? Playcentre offers a unique early childhood option for you and your child.

At Playcentre the adult stays with the child and is actively involved in the learning and playing. The 'adult' can be Mum, Dad, Grandma or Grandad. It's your choice. Playcentre is fun for adults too and provides a meeting place for great conversations, and care-giver support.

The centre is filled with jigsaws, puzzles, books, train sets, cars, blocks, dolls, prams, dress-ups, a mini kitchen and much more.





Rural Wellbeing

By now, you've likely read and heard about the Wellbeing Budget, and seen how the Government is delivering on our plan to address long-term challenges.

Agriculture and rural communities play a big part in New Zealand's wellbeing – it's the engine room of our economy. For communities like Methven to continue thriving, we need sustainable industry, and jobs for our young people. The Provincial Growth Fund investment into the Opuke Thermal Spa complex is a great example of how this Government is committed to our rural communities and maximising their potential.

Through the Wellbeing Budget this Government is supporting the agricultural sector with a \$122 million injection over four years to support the on-farm changes required to use land more sustainably while growing productivity. This is part of our \$229 million sustainable land use Budget package. This is on top of the work we've undertaken to eradicate M. bovis and protect our national herd – including fixing NAIT. We're also supporting farmers cleaning up our

rivers and waterways, investing in Research & Development and we've introduced the Rural Proofing Policy which makes sure every Government puts rural affairs at the heart of decision making.


