Council Fast Tracks Methven Water Treatment Upgrades

Ashburton District Councillors have approved up to \$9.4 million to improve Methven's drinking water – an upgrade that will commission detailed plans for a new membrane treatment plant, and build two new reservoirs to help meet peak demand on the scheme.

The decisions on Wednesday 28 July included the fast-tracking of a new treatment plant worth \$7.7 million, and the new reservoirs worth \$1.7 million.

Ashburton District Mayor Neil Brown said the new membrane treatment plant, which will treat water for the Methven and Methven Springfield schemes, will mean boil water notices are a thing of the past.

"These upgrades are great news. We had already planned for some of the work and now we have brought it forward to meet the needs of the community."

The town's water comes from a shallow groundwater intake near the north branch of the Ashburton River and water quality can be impacted during significant rainfall.

The new plant will be able to treat the water and filter it potentially at a molecular level. The water would then be held in the two new reservoirs, with a combined capacity of 1,128 cubic metres, for distribution to Methven residents.

Design of the membrane treatment plant scheduled for this year could take nine months but Councillors on Wednesday brought forward physical works budgets from year 2 and 3 so that key components needed for the plant could be purchased earlier and shipped.


Councillors opted for the new membrane treatment plant after considering a report on the feasibility of one combined water treatment plant for the Methven, Methven Springfield, Montalto, Mount Somers, and Mayfield schemes, which determined the solution not financially viable. Councillors also opted for an alternate recommendation in the report for a combined Methven and Methven-Springfield plant which would be more feasible.

The contract was awarded to Reliant Solutions to build two new reservoirs at the existing treatment plant 4km from Methven. This contract, worth \$1.7 million, involves earthworks, pipe laying, access tracks and fencing and installation of the reservoirs.

The existing concrete reservoir at the plant has been deemed an earthquake risk and will not be used once the two new reservoirs are in place.

The new tanks are made of special glassfused steel and will be imported from the UK.The construction and installation project for the new reservoirs is expected to take nine months.

Renewed calls for a "rat free New Zealand" prompted my looking into how this could be achieved.

Years ago, a friend from Canada surprised me by saving that Alberta (a state of Canada). is rat free. "How did they achieve this?" I wondered. In fact, Alberta is not the only area in the world that has effectively eradicated rats. South Georgia Island - a British territory, and Macquarie Island - a reserve of the Australian state of Tasmania, have applied massive amounts of poison in the last decade to rid themselves of the pest. Alberta's war on rats began back in the 1950s. Recognised research institutions, Zoos, Colleges and Universities are permitted to keep white rats. Pet rats are not permitted. Possession of a rat in Alberta can attract a fine of up to \$5,000.

Could we do the same or similar here in New Zealand with our pest population? 2021 marks five years since Predator Free 2050 was launched. We have many predators and pests - stoats, weasels, rats, mice, wasps, wallabies, rabbits, possums, and magpies to name a few. These pests do nothing for our environment, and contribute towards destroying it. Many of these pests thrive in our country because they don't have native predators. Some of the above are kept as pets. I have had numerous "pet" magpies that were injured, or kicked out of the parental nest, which I nursed back to health because I could not bear to see a distressed living thing. They made great pets, and provided our family with loads of entertainment with their hilarious antics - maggies really do have a sense of humour!

However, they are best suited to their native environment, and that is Australia, not here!

Google: Predator Free 2050 (the Department of Conservation website). This site gives suggestions on backyard trapping, and ideas for the community. Generally speaking,



anywhere people live, there will be rats hidden away, scrounging what food they can get. Setting traps around your house and garden is a great way to get rid of these nasty pests. Make sure that they are not where little children will be playing, or where your house

pets can he hurt. Your local hardware store will be able to

> advise you the on best sort of trap to use.

In Canada, "rat-free" was achieved through having free poison available, a Rat Patrol, a posse of officers armed with shotguns, and a zero tolerance for rats. If all of us did a little bit, in trapping and eradicating pests, then we could make a huge difference.

I'm all for Wallaby pies, rabbit pies, rabbit fur coats, and possum fibre garments providing the slaughter (that's a harsh word) is humanely achieved.

Laying my neck on the line, I think it's about time we had a magpie cull. The Annual Wallaby Shoot in South Canterbury nets great results - perhaps we could establish a magpie shoot.





MPS Production!


Last month there were photos of our amazing production in the Snowfed.

We have written about our part. On the 7th and 8th of July MPS had a production about Māori stories which started off as four children going tramping and meeting the earth mother Papatūānuku (Mrs Furndorfler) who told them stories about Māori history.

Our story (Year 6) was about a Māori woman named Raureka who after she argued with her whanau, left her home in search of new land but she stumbled across a Ngai Tahu tribe sitting beside a river. Our performance (Opuke D) was about Matariki. The story we chose about Matariki was about Rangi-nui, Papatūānuku, and their children, when Rangi-nui and Papatūānuku were separated. Tāwhirimātea, god of wind, was the one who disagreed completely, so he then gouged his eyes out and threw them into the Milky Way Galaxy, therefore creating the stars of Matariki. Then came our dance.

GROW YOUR OWN

There are signs of action in the garden – weeds are germinating, bulbs appearing and the lawn is growing.

Root crops such as carrots and parsnips are sending up new green growth, which means they are moving from a dormant phase to a spring phase. Carrots are annual crops so the longer days are a trigger for the reproductive stage of their life cycle to begin. Their eating quality will diminish as the plant transfers nutrients into making a flower head, so don't delay in eating these wonderful veges.

Rain and damp days mean there isn't much to do in the vege garden, but don't forget to pick your winter brassicas, such as rocket and mustard. These hardy plants provide some tasty additions to winter stir-fries or salads. Rocket is a different species but belongs in the same family as cabbage, kale, cauliflower and Brussel sprouts. They originated in the Mediterranean area of southern Europe.

Despite looking and tasting quite different, cabbage, kale, cauliflower etc are all the same species. This species has been cultivated for several thousand years, and original varieties were popular garden vegetables with the Greeks and Romans.

They believed cabbages should not be grown near grape vines, in case there was an influence on the flavour of the wine. There's no record of any brassicas being poisonous, so are popular among foragers.

Water cress is also a member of the brassica family. It grows in quite a few water races in the local area, but the quality may be dubious because of water quality. Contamination by E. coli is a possibility. Growing at home though is an option – it can be raised in large buckets



or troughs, or in garden soil, but in the ground it tends to develop a strong, bitter flavour.

If growing in a bucket of water, change the water weekly. Add an organic fertiliser, such as liquid compost, to kickstart growth, but once it is growing well, keep the water clean and wash the foliage before eating.


