On a very cold Wednesday last week, Alma Lochhead visited Methven to mark the official handover of the land on which the proposed new Methven House will be built.

The Lochhead Trust has gifted the land at Camrose Estate to the Methven Care Trust (MCT), a real milestone for the campaign.

With a target of over \$5 million to raise in five years, every little step forward along the way is a boost to the cause. With over two years of fundraising behind them, the Methven Care Trust team has been organising some great events, large and small, working hard to achieve their goal.

When thanked by MCT for the gift of land, Mrs Lochhead replied, "Alan would be very pleased", referring to her late husband. MCT is most grateful to be the beneficiaries of Mr and Mrs Lochhead's long standing and on going generosity and kindness to the community of Methven.

At the 40th Anniversary of Methven House earlier this year, Jo Suyker MCT Chairperson, said in her speech that it was a tribute to the Methven community, the town had cared for its elderly for four decades in the former maternity hospital building on Morgan Street.

"Forty years of care, 40 years of commitment, 40 years of empathy and 40 years of devotion that has been given to the people that have walked through the doors and made Methven House their home. That, quite frankly, is a mighty effort for a community of this size."

Sue van den Heuvel, Fundraising Co-ordinator for MCT said, "This is a monumental step forward in our fundraising campaign and we thank everyone to date who has donated and supported this vital cause for our district and we look forward to continuing forward on our fundraising mission."

Maori Language Week 11-17 September

Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori or Māori language week is being celebrated around the country this week.

In celebration of the language, New Zealand History has released a list of 100 Māori words that every New Zealander should know and be comfortable pronouncing.

Just a few of the words listed include greetings and place names, body parts and the Marae, some examples are:

Greetings

E nohu rā - Goodbye (from a person leaving) Haera rā - Goodbye (from a person staying) Haera mai - Welcome! Come!

Hei konā rā - Goodbye (less formal)

Kia ora - Hi! G'day! (general informal greeting)

Morena - (Good) morning!

Nau mai - Welcome! Come!

Tēnā koe - formal greeting to one person Tēnā kōrua - formal greeting to two people Tēnā koutou - formal greeting to many people

Tēnā tātou katoa - formal inclusive greeting

to everybody present, including

Components of place names

Terms for geographical features, such as hills, rivers, cliffs, streams, mountains, the coast; and adjectives describing them, such as small, big, little and long, are found in many place names. Here is a list so you can recognise them:

Au - current

Awa - river

Iti - small, little

Kai - in a place name, this signifies a place where a particular food source was plentiful, e.g., Kaikōura, the place where crayfish (kōura) abounded and were eaten

Manga - stream

Mānia - plain

Maunga - mountain

Moana - sea, or large inland 'sea', e.g., Taupō

Motu - island

Nui - large, big

Ō or o - means 'of' (so does a, ā); many names begin with Ō, meaning the place of so-andso, e.g., Ōkahukura, Ōkiwi, Ōhau One - sand, earth

Pae - ridge, range

Papa - flat

Poto - short

Puke - hill

Roa - long

Roto - lake; inside

Tai - coast, tide

Wai - water

Whanga - harbour, bay

If you are going to try your hand at speaking Maori, here is a guide on pronunciation.

The following English equivalents are a rough guide to pronouncing vowels in Māori:

a as in far

e as in desk and the first 'e' in where; it should be short and sharp

i as in fee, me, see

o as in awe (not 'oh!')

u as in sue, boot

There are fewer consonants, and only a few are different from English:

r should not be rolled. It is pronounced quite close to the sound of 'l' in English, with the tongue near the front of the mouth.

t is pronounced more like 'd' than 't', with the tip of the tongue slightly further back from the teeth

wh counts as a consonant; the standard modern pronunciation is close to the 'f' sound. In some districts it is more like an 'h'; in others more like a 'w' without the 'h'; in others again more like the old aspirated English pronunciation of 'wh' ('huence' for whence)

ng counts as a consonant and is pronounced like the 'ng' in 'singer'. It is not pronounced like the 'ng' in 'finger', i.e., Whāngārei is pronounced Far-n(g)ah-ray (not Fonggah-ray); Tauranga is pronounced Tow- (to rhyme with sew) rah-n(g)ah (not Tow-ranggah).

The Mahuri Junior Hub at Methven Primary School have lots of new children transitioning to school on a Friday. To help them learn about our routines and build relationships with the children and teachers we run a Discovery Time.

During Discovery, the children are focusing on their M.P.S. star attributes of being Sporting, Responsible, Trustworthy and Responsible. At Discovery Time the children get to choose from a huge variety of activities that provide multiple opportunities for learning. These opportunities promote being creative, curious, adventurous and resourceful.

Investing in the Next Generation

In 2017 YMCA South & Mid Canterbury celebrates 100 Years of 'Investing in the Next Generation'.

Underpinning all their work are the YMCA values of Caring, Respect, Honesty and Responsibility. They're a not-for-profit organisation, whose programmes and services – provided at no or minimal cost to participants – impact the lives of in excess of 4,500 people every year across the region.

Named the 2016 SC Business Excellence Award Community Organisation Category Winner, in recognition of the difference they make in the community.

The 2017 South & Mid Canterbury Youth Survey is the third survey to be have been undertaken as a public service and advocacy

project aimed at taking the pulse of the district's youth on a range of topics. 724 young people aged 12-24 years answered questions online about what it is like to live

A not-for-profit organisation, whose programmes... impact the lives of in excess of 4,500 people every year across the region

in this area, which was extended this year to include youth throughout the Ashburton, Mackenzie, Timaru and Waimate districts.



The 39-question survey focuses on attitudes toward the four districts, participation in and attitudes toward various activities, education and career plans, and well-being. The survey is fully independent; YMCA receives no government or philanthropic funding for it.

Key findings paint a mostly positive picture, with results remarkably similar across Districts and largely consistent with the 2015 and 2014 surveys, according to Michèle Keggenhoff, YMCA Marketing, Communications and Fundraising Manager.

This year, however, the survey included an additional question about social media usage by young people, which yielded the following results: Facebook, Facebook Messenger, Instagram and Snapchat are the key social media platforms used by young people, with roughly 60% using one of these multiple times each day. About 80% of young people use these platforms -- and also YouTube -- daily or a couple of times per week. Twitter does not appear to be much used.



"Stars in Your Eyes" is based on the TV show, where ordinary people are magically transformed, through a haze, into their favourite stars for the evening.


The competition is open to all ages, with only 12 acts making it through to the final on 14th October.

Mt Hutt Open for the Holidays



Thanks to weather not experienced in about a decade, New Zealand's Best Ski Field – Mt Hutt in Canterbury – will now remain open until the end of the New Zealand school holidays.

Due initially to close on Sunday October the 8th, the 313-hectare ski field is now set to remain open until Sunday 15th October, weather dependent.

"We've got absolutely oodles of snow and so staying open through to the end of the NZ school holidays makes perfect sense," says James McKenzie, Mt Hutt Ski Area Manager.

"When you factor in our Spring Pass prices, that kids 10 and under are free at Mt Hutt, and the close proximity to Christchurch airport for our non-local guests, that is a pretty good offering for your spring school holidays."

The Kids4Free Deal initiative between tourism operators in Methven provides several accommodation, dining and activities options as well as a Mt Hutt lift pass free of charge for children aged 10 and under.

Mt Hutt, which was voted officially New Zealand's best ski resort again in 2016, has had a massive season with snow fall not seen in a decade.

"We've just enjoyed one of the best weekends of the season to date following the 20cm top-up of powdery snow we received on Friday the first day of Spring," says James.

"Conditions on trail are primo and off-trail has been sensational."

The altitude of 2086m making it one of the highest ski areas in New Zealand and an annual four-meter snow fall, Mt Hutt typically results in one of the longest snow seasons in New Zealand often with powdery conditions.

Located on the doorstep of Methven, Mt Hutt is Canterbury's playground, a big mountain with wide groomed slopes, all-lift access for all abilities, top to bottom terrain parks with world class jumps and friendly Kiwi hospitality.

In 2017 the skiable terrain has grown by an additional 21 new hectares, new automated snow guns and modified terrain at the upper mountain boost snow coverage on the higher runs and the addition of a pisten bully winch groomer will help maintain that snow for longer. During the season, a spa



Deadline Approaching For Wood Burners

Ashburton District Council is reminding residents who live in the Clean Air Zone and wish to install a low emission wood burner that they have until 31 October to get their building consent applications in.

Environment Canterbury is phasing out older-style and low emission wood burners, and after the 31 October, residents inside the Ashburton Clean Air Zone (properties inside the Ashburton township) will only be able to apply to install an ultra-low emission wood burner.

Council Building Services Manager Michael Wong says there has been an influx of applications during the last few months to get a building consent before the cut-off date.

"We've been kept very busy processing these applications and we anticipate the trend will continue well into October. If you think this deadline affects you, and you haven't got your consent sorted, please come and see us with your application. We'll be accepting them right up until 31 October, but after that date, it will be too late."

To be granted a Solid Fuel Heater Building Consent, applicants must provide a floor plan of their house indicating where the wood burner and smoke alarms will go, the wood burner specifications and a completed application form.

"You don't need to have purchased your new wood burner prior to applying for the consent, we just need to know what you intend to use. Once we grant the consent, you will have a year to start the installation work, and another year to complete it. Once it is finished, we will inspect the work and if it meets compliance, we will issue a code compliance certificate."

The Solid Fuel Heater application form and a checklist is available at the Council office and on the Council website www.ashburtondc.govt.nz

Grow Your Own

It's been a cold and windy week... but that's spring for you. Many people like to get a head start with their vege gardens and plant summer crops, such as carrots, early. But this is often counter-productive – the soil is cold and often wet in spring, so seeds may struggle to germinate, and if they do succeed in germinating may run straight to seed (bolt) because the cold conditions make them react as if they have just come through a winter.

After winter, annuals, such as carrots are programmed to change from growing vegetatively to reproducing, and making flowers and seeds.

So – wait until spring is really here before planting carrots, beetroot or parsnips. I usually sow mine in October when the soil is warmer. Seeds sown then will germinate and (hopefully) grow quickly without being checked or stressed by cold temps. Soil fertility (especially the crucial nitrogen) availability is also better when the soil is warmer.

Strawberries can be planted on a sunny day and when the soil is not too wet to dig. They take quite a bit of work but the flavour of home-grown strawberries is amazing compared to shop-bought ones so planting some is well worth the effort.


Strawberry plants last several years so take care when planting. Choose a sunny spot but not one that will be too hot in summer. Add compost or aged manure to the soil and dig in well.




Think about the boundaries of the proposed patch because they will need some sort of cover to protect the fruit from the birds and a compact patch will be easier to cover than a long row. Plant them about 30-40 cm apart and mulch around them with pine needles so that the fruit is lifted off the ground.

The acidity of the pine needles helps keep mould at bay. An alternative is to lay down a sheet of weed mat on the patch and bury the edges so that it is nice and tight, then cut holes in the mat and plant the strawberries into the holes.

Strawberries can be successfully grown in containers or pots. They like good drainage so pots can be ideal if they don't dry out. Use a good quality potting mix or compost and keep an eye on moisture.


