# Celebrities Voting finishes this Saturday

Ashburton District electors who are yet to cast their vote in the local body elections are being encouraged to complete their voting papers and geting them into the Coucil Office before voting officially closes at 12 noon on Saturday 12 October.

Council Chief Executive Hamish Riach is urging people to get in early and ensure their vote makes it to the Council office in time.

"We are now well into the election period, and voters should have received their papers in the mail in the last two weeks. With only a few days left to make your voice count on who will represent our community, now is the time to complete your papers and take them in."

"Local body elections are the community's chance to have their say about the future of their district and choose who will make local decisions that will affect them for the next three years. Make the most of this opportunity and exercise your democratic right these elections," Mr Riach adds.

People who have not received their voting papers can still take part in the elections by casting a special vote. They can do this by visiting the Council office or contacting their local electoral officer.

Elections are being held for the mayoralty; Ashburton, Western and Eastern Wards; and the Ashburton Licensing Trust. A by-election will be called for the Methven Community Board later this year.





# Free Child Car Seat Recycling now in Ashburton District

Ashburton residents can now recycle their expired, damaged or unwanted child car seats, for free, through the SeatSmart programme, with collection sites in Ashburton, Rakaia and Methyen.

This comes after the Ashburton District Council partnered with the national child car seat recycling programme to offer the service. Ashburton is the only district where it is free to recycle a seat, thanks to support from the council.

Service Delivery Group Manager Neil McCann says the initiative supports the council's goal of reducing waste ending up in landfill, which is a great outcome for the community.

"We are proud to be partnering with the SeatSmart programme to provide this free service. A variety of common household goods are already accepted free of charge

for recycling at our Resource Recovery Parks and drop-off sites, and we are pleased to expand this list to include child car seats. It gives residents even more opportunity to reduce their waste and engage with more sustainable solutions."

Seats can be dropped off at the Methven recycling yard (corner of Methven Chertsey Road and Line Road), Rakaia Resource Recovery Park (West Town Belt), and Ashburton Resource Recovery Park.

SeatSmart was created by Hastings-based recycling specialist 3R Group and has seen strong growth since launching in April 2016. The three new sites in the Ashburton District bring the number of collection sites in the South Island to 20, and the total number nationwide to 37.

Programme manager Toni Bye says she's

pleased to be able to bridge the gap between SeatSmart collection sites in

Christchurch and Geraldine, increasing access to the programme. "We're delighted to have the council's backing for a programme that not only diverts waste from landfill but also raises awareness of expiry dates on car seats," she says.

Seats collected by the programme are dismantled by offenders in Department of Correction community work programmes as well as by social enterprises which employ people who have a disability or are disadvantaged or marginalised, Toni says. "This means recycling a seat not only recovers useful resources that would otherwise go to landfill but also provides meaningful work – it's a real win-win all round."

Up to 70% of a seat's material (by weight) is recyclable. "Key materials such as plastic, metal and harnesses can be recycled or reused. The harnesses, for example, are made into bags, while the metal is easily recycled," Toni says.

SeatSmart also promotes road safety by encouraging parents and care-givers to check seats for expiry dates. "People don't always know that child car seats have expiry dates. The extremes of temperature in cars, stress on plastic parts, all takes a toll on seats. It's therefore important to know when seats are due to expire and get them out of circulation, ideally by recycling them," Toni says

### Retrospective Travel Reflections - LAPAN TOP TIPS

After visiting Japan several times I learned that there are some very exciting bits that help make the holiday easier and more enjoyable. There are also many tips, many I learnt from my friend, Yuki, and some I wished I had known earlier!

Japan is a cash society - meaning you need to carry plenty of cash with you at all times and to save all the coins you receive in change as they will be needed (refer to further down). Cards are accepted in hotels etc. but not readily used in machines to buy tickets, food or to go shopping with. The rate of the Yen fluctuates a lot so keep an eye out on the exchange rate once you know your travel dates and change money before leaving New Zealand if it is good value.

Vending machines are used for just about everything and can be found on nearly every street corner and lined up within supermarket entrances. They sell drinks and food which both come in hot and cold versions, (often from the same machine which had me totally intrigued). I especially

loved the short shots of cold caffeine and the doughnut choices. There is a lot of decision making to be done but it is all part of the fun! Toys, makeup, you name it, it can come out of a machine and I collected quite a selection

of little Pokemon gifts as souvenirs. Change is needed and most use 100Y and smaller denominations of coins. Many restaurants also use this concept for ordering food, where you select your meal and put in coins, take a ticket and present at the counter. This means

Daiso shops (or 100 Y shops) are a cheap place to pick up little gifts and cute stuff to bring home. A little like our \$2 shop, but the products are mostly all made in Japan. Another few hours can easily be spent in the larger stores and a few extra kilos easily added

to the luggage. I was a sucker for the stickers and cute stationery items, but could have easily brought home the toast smiley cutters and the cat decorated gardening gloves!

Toilets. Well what an experience. They usually exceptionally clean public conveniences and very small and low in hotel facilities. They music so your, play usually public noises, are covered somewhat (or to make you go, as often water trickling with birds singing, never was quite sure). They have buttons.

Many, many buttons with features, which if you can work out the small diagrams, you can use. Beware...do not over push these buttons! On a school Japan trip I was challenged by the students to try out the functions as I had been (quite rightly so) reluctant to use. Stupidly I



the service staff are not dealing with cash. Cheap delicious meals are readily available. We used these food chains for breakfasts and if not, the local Seven 11 had excellent fast food choices, all for \$5-\$10 NZ for a big meal.

accepted and tried the bidet water function, not realising that it would be so powerful. I quickly learned that frantically pushing the button to stop it only increased the pressure and the amount of water being gushed! I had to leap out of the way only to find myself drenched and requiring a quick change before boarding our flight to NZ. The kids thought it was hilarious, me, not so much.

Hint- take time to figure out the functions before sitting down!

Train travel is exceptional in Japan. Local trains, underground systems and bullet trains all run efficiently and are all accessible. It is a cost effective way to get around, especially if you pre-purchase train passes before heading over. The lines and systems are somewhat mind blowing and even the process of purchasing trip tickets from machines can be daunting (see again the need for change). However, I found that there are always Official "Help" officers available and local people are always keen to have a chance to practice their English and help you out. You just need to smile and ask for assistance. Bullet trains are like flying on planes and I read recently that luggage size is now restricted to smaller bags, larger ones needing to be pre-booked and checked in prior to travel. I will need to investigate this before my next visit.

Subways are busy and avoid peak morning and evening travel if you do not wish to experience the "push in" method of getting passengers on board. Staying out of the centre of cities like Tokyo is cheaper and using the subway to reach tourist spots is a very worthwhile idea, plus another Japanese experience you must do.

Local trains above ground are wonderful cheap, and you get a view. I used these a lot to travel out of Kyoto to surrounding towns like Nara on day trips. Buses also work well but are a little longer as there are numerous stops, but you can purchase multi stop tickets that also include scenic routes. It is worth Googling

Lonely Planet for suggestions on these.

**Hiring a car** is possible and driving out in the country is easy, but parking is a nightmare and city driving is slow going with the traffic.

Washing machines- staying in Air BnB's (which I recommend), I came across the amazing Japanese washing machine. It is a washer and dryer in one! Again, the button issue took some figuring out, but so many impressive choices! I am sure we had these around in the 70's but not sure why they never took off? This machine saves space and completes the chore efficiently. Other hostel accomodation all had laundry facilities, again coin operated. I did not see laundromats, but I did use hotel services. Be prepared to pay quite a high cost for this in comparison to other Asian destinations.

Umbrellas- they are everywhere. Used for shade and intermittent rain showers they are the must carry item. The humidity, except in winter made raincoats too hot. There is a real etiquette involved in negotiating your way around others on the pavement when everyone has one. Many a polite, but obvious oath, was uttered in my direction until I figured it out. Umbrellas are tricky to pack and I always purchased one over in Japan. Cheap ones are readily available that you can donate as you leave. Most restaurants in smaller villages provide them at their door to be returned later and umbrella stands can be found at the doors of shops etc. to leave yours in while shopping or eating. Amazing honesty system! The more expensive umbrellas I saw were glorious, traditional and modern versions decorated as only the Japanese can do so tastefully and one is definitely on my hit list for the next shopping excursion.

Hint- do not buy a Samurai style, sword umbrella and expect to carry it on to the plane as one student attempted to do! I actually think, even as packed luggage it could cause a stir as they are very authentic looking.

Pillows - unless staying in high end

Heartland

accommodation pillows are very different than the ones we use at home, very small flat squares or there is only a small roll provided. I tended to create my own pillow using a rolled up travel towel with my softer clothes tucked inside it or my travel pillow. Sleeping flat on the traditional roll out bedding is great for some and I personally loved it but check when booking that you have a European style bed if that is a priority for you. I loved the whole process of clearing the room of the tea table and cushions to create a bedroom, unrolling the bedding and futon onto the tatami (traditional woven grass flooring tiles) matting each evening. It was a bit of a mission getting up and down from the floor, but I slept brilliantly and my back thanked me, plus the wonderful smell of the matting was a real sleep remedy. Try it out!



Chopsticks - important etiquette is involved. There are many rules in the use of chopsticks, too many to list here, but I highly recommend Googling these as it is important to be seen as respectful of a culture and its practices when in the host country. The most important ones to me were not sticking your chopsticks into the rice upright as this is how rice is served in funeral practices, not to wave them around and not to share food across to someone using them. The thing is to give it a go, and again, ask for assistance or clarification. The people I met loved the fact that I wanted to learn and try new things and that I wanted to do the right thing.

After all, isn't that what we all would like from our visitors?

### **Bertie Holmes**

I have one other passion and that is spending time with my delightful grandchildren Hillary and James.

I have belonged to the Ashburton Society of arts for many years. I held many positions on the committee, all were fun and rewarding. I have been privileged to be awarded a Life Membership.

# Having chooks is great for your garden!

It's been a tumultuous couple of weeks of spring weather, but that's normal for this time of year.

The garden feels behind compared to how it usually is at the beginning of October. Tomato seedlings are growing slowly because of the cold nights we've had, and I've only just transplanted pepper seedlings, partly because I'm behind with jobs and partly due to the cold. But the peas are up, I've finished two new strawberry beds, one with weed mat and one mulched with pine needles. My broad beans are flowering, garlic is growing and we've eaten six heads of broccoli that were all ready at once.

The old chooks have started laying again and we have bought some new ones. Chooks are an important part of my gardening regime because their manure is such a good fertiliser. It's rich in nitrogen and phosphorus especially. The floor of the chook house has wood shavings and when a lot of droppings has accumulated, I bag it up then give a handful to each seedling as I plant - it's fantastic food for tomatoes, corn, peppers, zucchinis or brassicas. I don't use it when planting seeds or for potatoes (too much nitrogen will give lots of green tops but not as many potatoes underneath).

When planting seeds I use Vegemin fertiliser (a natural fertiliser available from Essential Nutrition in Tinwald), drizzled along the row and gently worked in with a hand fork before planting the seed.

Nitrogen is the one of the most important nutrients for plant growth and lack of it is often the limiting factor when growing veges. Most veges need lots of it (but not potatoes). The wood shavings are high in carbon so it is important to make sure the ratio of droppings to shavings is high or you will be applying too much carbon to the soil, which will deplete the soil of nitrogen.

The carbon/nitrogen idea is an important one to know when you're gardening - many things that are used to mulch are high in carbon such as wood chips, cardboard, straw (but not pea straw). These are broken down by bacteria and other soil micro-organisms that need nitrogen for their food, so they use up available nitrogen in the soil as they break down carbon. So, whenever you add things that are high in carbon, you also need a high nitrogen source such as manure, blood and bone or fish fertiliser.

Pea straw is wonderful in that it is balanced in terms of carbon and nitrogen, so using it as a mulch does not deplete the soil of much-needed nitrogen.

92,000 new jobs have been created under this Government.




