

There will be constant entertainment ringside with a full schedule of equestrian events for the day. We also encourage you to take



The nominees; Tammy Dickson, Leonie Campbell and Richard Owen were invited to speak and share what they would bring and contribute to the Methven Community Board, if they were elected.

Eligible voters in Methven are urged to check their mail over coming days for their voting papers, as voting is now open for the Methven Community Board by-election.

The by-election is being held to fill one vacancy on the board, with three candidates standing for election. The Methven Community Board consists of five members to represent the Methven township. Only four nominations were received for the board when nominations closed for the triennial elections in October last year.

Voting papers have begun being mailed to eligible electors from 27 January, and they must be filled out and returned by 12 noon, Tuesday 18 February to be counted.

Ashburton District Council Chief Executive, Hamish Riach, is encouraging residents to complete their voting papers on time.

"The Methven Community Board advocates for the town's interests and brings local decision-making closer to residents. It is now up to voters to decide who should fill the final vacancy and represent them on the board. Please don't leave it too late. Postal votes must in the ballot box by 12 noon sharp on 18 February, so give yourself enough time for your papers to be returned in the post."

Completed voting papers should be posted by Thursday 13 February to reach the Electoral Officer on time by 12 noon, 18 February.

Voting papers can also be dropped into the ballot box at the Council office (5 Baring Square West, Ashburton) during normal office hours until 12 noon, 18 February. A ballot box and special voting facilities will be available at the Mt Hutt Memorial Hall (160 Main Street, Methven) on Friday 14 February from 2pm to 5pm and on Tuesday 18 February from 9am until 12 noon.

The electoral roll for the by-election is available for inspection at the Council office and Ashburton Public Library, as well as the Methven i-Site. Special voting facilities are also available at the Council office until voting closes on Tuesday 18 February.

Voting papers should arrive in mailboxes between 27 January and 1 February. If eligible voters have not received their papers by 1 February, they should contact the Council on 03 307

Non-surgical management of Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL)

Unbelievably it is only in the last five years that researchers have started asking if we NEED surgery to stabilise a knee after an ACL rupture!

In the UK, Australia and New Zealand it has been the standard treatment option for ruptures in the under 40, sporting population for over 30 years.

Searching the internet there are many examples of US athletes performing with no ACL. The only one I could find in NZ was Sam Dickson who returned to NZ Sevens to represent in the 2016 Olympics after an ACL rupture. Due to time frames he opted to rehabilitate rather than miss the games due to surgery and participated successfully.

Recent research has been looking at the question in more detail. Initially the theory was that the ACL reconstruction prevented OA and meniscal damage. That does not seem to be the case and in fact there is possibly more OA in those who have had surgery.

There is now even evidence that the ACL can potentially heal! Previously it was suspected blood was unable to clot within the joint and therefore was unable to scar and heal.

MRI scans have now demonstrated healing in previously ruptured ACL ligaments.



One new study from Norway found favourably in return to sport for rehabbed sportsmen

and concluded "athletes may be overtreated with ACLR surgery, but undertreated when it comes to rehabilitation" (Grindem, Arundale and Ardern 2018).

The rehabilitation is pretty much the same post ACL rupture for those rehabbing, versus those after surgery but with the former, the body is not coping with the pain, inflammation and inhibition from using existing muscle, for a graft or drilling in to bone as an anchor. Nor does the rehab need to be slow to protect the six month remodelling process for the graft. As such, the 9-12 month rehab process post ACL surgery can be reduced to 8-12 weeks depending on the athlete and the sport. Strong quadriceps, equal hop tests and choosing to opt for rehab rather than surgery are all positively correlated with less knee symptoms at five years post injury (Filbay et al 2017).

I was also pleased to see that rehabilitation guidelines recommend 'top up' physiotherapy months after return to sport to ensure maintaining muscle strength and dynamic control. I frequently see clients in the clinic who have knee pain a few years post surgery related to their muscle control as opposed to their knee surgery.

Clients all dread to hear they have sustained an ACL rupture – anticipating missing out on sport, enduring surgery and months of physiotherapy. It is increasingly clear that rehabilitation is a definite option to successful return to all sports including high speed pivoting and impact. And apparently as in all things having a positive outlook and visualising success helps the outcome too!!

Have your say on our District Road Speeds

Several roads around the District may be set to receive a new speed limit as part of the Council's Speed Limit Review, and residents are invited to have their say on the proposals.

The Council is seeking to reduce injuries on its roading network and ensure there is a consistent district-wide approach to managing speed, and is proposing to alter some speed limits.

The last time the Council conducted a speed limit review was in 2012, and Mayor Neil Brown says that since that time, the district has seen significant growth and expansion, particularly on the outskirts of many urban communities.

"The Council is constantly assessing the physical aspects of our expansive roading network to ensure it is safe for all users. Sometimes, this means road improvements that help improve safety under the current speed limit, but in some instances it means lowering the speed limit to ensure that the roads have safe travel speeds.

We want to make sure that everyone who uses our roads gets to their destination safely. Help us determine if we've got the speed proposals right by having your say when consultation opens. We are welcoming feedback from everyone."

Mayor Brown added that although speed changes are not proposed for all Ashburton District roads, residents are welcome to include their suggestions for any roads around the district.

In addition to growing urban areas, the Council has also received

several speed limit suggestions from residents in the last eight years, and these ideas have helped to formulate the proposals being put forward.

The consultation will be open from 27 January until 8 March at 5pm.



Granted, it can be difficult sometimes. Family circumstances, study, or a job that keeps you especially busy, it can be easy to sit out elections thinking it won't suit.

It's been hot and windy... a bit of rain today (Tuesday), is welcome.

It's apparent that many crops are thriving if they get enough water, and that they struggle without! Beans, zucchinis and leafy greens love lots of water, and young seedlings don't need lots but they need it every hot day.

At our place it's tomato time and on the hottest day of the summer so far (last Sunday), I slaved over a hot stove and bottled tomatoes. This was not the best idea I've ever had but it got the job done. I'll do another batch on a cooler day!

Bottling tomatoes is easy but it's important to stick to the procedure so you don't risk contamination. Sterilising the jars, lids and utensils is crucial.

First of all I cut up the tomatoes (I don't bother skinning them but you could if you're fussy), then stew them in a big pot on the stove. I add gently fried onions and basil (leave these out and do just tomatoes if you want – I just happened to have spare basil and onions).



Wash and rinse a wide-mouthed funnel, ladle, tongs and spatula as well and put these and the lids in a saucepan of boiling water. Boil these for 10 minutes and make sure the jars have at least 10 minutes in the oven and the tomato mixture has simmered for at least 10 minutes. If you stir them, put the spatula back in the pot of boiling water not on the bench, to ensure everything stays sterile.

When the 10 minutes is up, take a couple of jars out of the oven using a clean tea towel (don't touch the tops) and ladle the tomato mixture into the jar. Leave about 1-2 cm of space at the top. Using tongs and without touching the inside of the lids, put lids on and screw tightly.

It's a bit of a bother but lovely to have your own home-grown produce to use later.

Bottled tomatoes retain flavour better that freezing and they don't take up valuable freezer space. Also, if we have an emergency like an earthquake and the power is off for days, they don't go to waste.

Keep them simmering, and stir occasionally while you wash the jars and lids in hot soapy water, then rinse and put in the oven at 110 degrees.
