Lauriston School Support has won the 2018 Supreme Award at Ashburton's greatest annual celebration of volunteers, the Trustpower Community Awards.

Voluntary groups from Ashburton Timaru and Waitaki gathered with representatives from Trustpower, Ashburton, Timaru and Waitaki District Council and the community at the Ashburton Trust Events Centre to hear how 15 groups and three young people are making an impact in their community. Trustpower Community and Communications Advisor Ashleigh Cleaver says Lauriston School Support were a top choice due to unyielding efforts to provide the best educational experience for students at Lauriston.

"When school pools were being shut down due to a lack of funding, the Lauriston Community identified swim education as being important and that the LSS would do whatever was necessary for the school pool to remain functioning. Through massive funding of the group, and approaching local businesses and the community with partnership opportunities they had the funds required to push ahead. Not only this, but the group have funnelled loads of other funds they've raised into the school supporting the costs for outdoor education and camps for the whole school, educational toys and modern learning environment furniture for classrooms, technology such as iPad and computers, play-ground repairs and

the running of the school swimming pool" In attendance for winning the Supreme Award, Lauriston School Support received a framed certificate, a trophy, and \$2,000 prize money.

The group will go on to represent Ashburton at the 2018 Trustpower National Community Awards, when volunteers from 26 regions from around New Zealand gather in Tauranga next March.

It's the first time Ashburton, Timaru and Waitaki have celebrated together at a single awards function and the venue location will alternate between the three regions each year.

Where are the keas?

He told us about keas and what kills keas. Did you know keas live for up to 40 years?

Mike told us that there were some male keas at Mt Hutt last year, but they aren't there anymore. There are alot of predators eating kea eggs and chicks, so female keas won't go there. He also told us that there are some traps that can catch lots of rats, stoats, weasels, hedgehogs and possums. Mike also told us that the new traps can reset itself and can count how much it caught.

Mike said he needs our help to catch rabbits to put in the traps as bait and get the traps working. Mike told us to visit next term to help set up the traps. He said they need more female keas at Mt Hutt to hatch more eggs in a predator free zone.

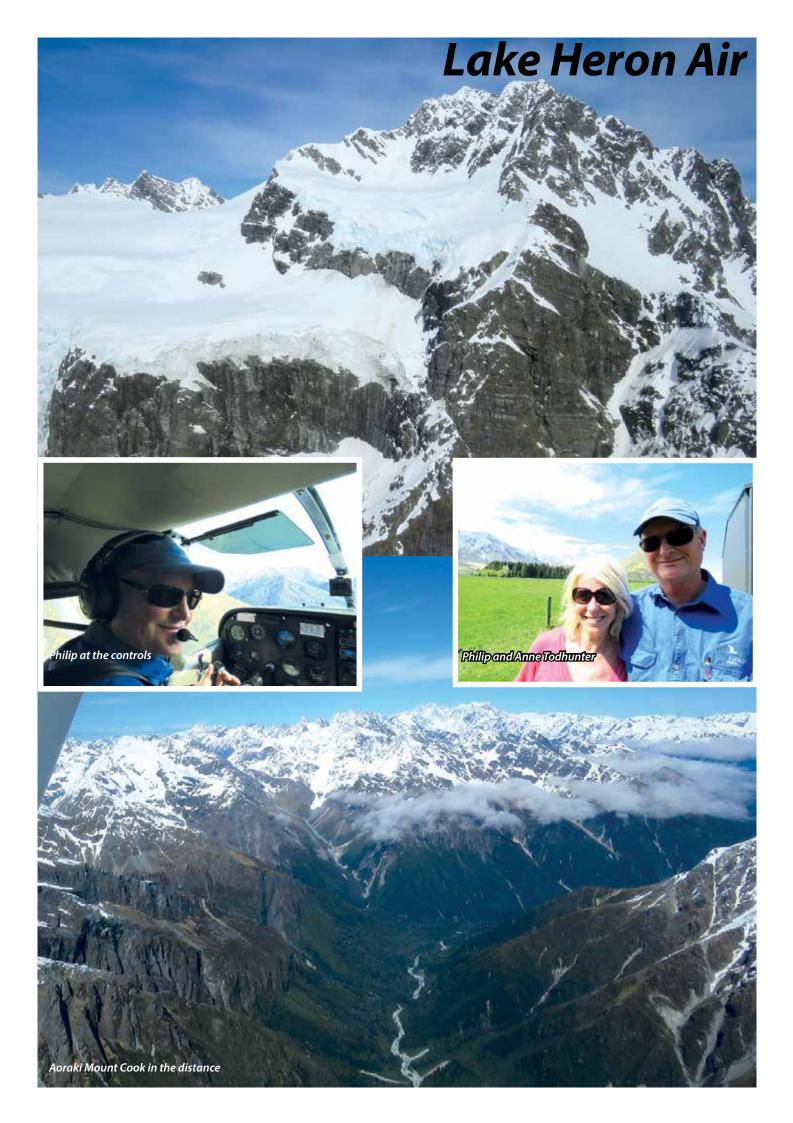

is Taking Off!

Right on our doorstep, just over the back of Mount Hutt is some of New Zealand's most stunning scenery. This is the New Zealand heartland.

A new business, Lake Heron Air, is based at Lake Heron Station, and owned by the Todhunter family. The Station is a very pleasant drive from Mount Somers, not far from Methven. On arrival at the station, the sweeping lawns surrounding the gracious homestead greet you.

The company operates a Cessna 185 for the scenic flights, and there is a great choice of viewing on offer. PhilipTodhunter is the Chief Pilot and has many years of flying experience. He attained his Private Pilots Licence (PPL) in 1984, going on to attain his Commercial Pilots Licence (CPL), working for Air Safaris at Lake Tekapo, and a Helicopter Licence in 1988. He has had 31 years experience as a helicopter pilot, which has included two summers in Antarctica as a "taxi and ferrying service." Philip's wife Anne, is now undertaking her Private Pilots Licence - aviation is in the blood of this family!

Lake Heron Air is offering a number of scenic trips. The 185 is a perfect aircraft for this kind of flying and sightseeing. It is a comfortable six seater (five passengers plus the pilot), and as it's a high wing aircraft; you have uninterrupted views of the snow-capped mountains beneath you. It climbs powerfully, and flies ever so smoothly.

The day I visited, we went to the Garden Of Eden and Allah. I have flown in the back country numerous times before, and if you haven't; be prepared for jaw-dropping scenery that will leave you speechless. (You may even need to book a second trip to take in what your eyes are showing you). It will feel like you can reach out and touch the peaks as you effortlessly slide over them. Piercing mountains and deep valleys open up before your eyes, spectacular glaciers ripple down you'll be astounded at how much country there is in there. Braided rivers, trickling streams and slender waterfalls accentuate the breathtaking visual feast that is our Southern Alps. Aoraki Mount Cook rises majestically a few mountains back from where we are. From here; you may wonder why it's called a cloud piercer when it looks

like a flat topped, giant sized, wedge of cake - completely different to the southwestern view that you see from Lake Pukaki or Mount Cook Village. In fact, you are closer to the West Coast than the East Coast at this point. The landscape is wild, beautiful, and untamed. Glacially fed blue lakes bring contrast to the pure white snow and deepest green of the valleys.

From Lake Heron Station; Fox Glacier is only half an hour's flying time - a perfect place to drop in to for a cup of coffee or lunch, if you're staying at the Station's beautifully appointed accommodation.

Gliding across the Arrowsmith Range; we gently come in to land back at the Station with the azure blue of Lake Heron stretching into the distance. Anne, the warmest hostess; arrives with home-made baking warm from the oven, and coffee and tea supplies. Basking in blue skies and gorgeous sunshine; it's clear this lovely couple want to share their love of the back country with us all

At Lake Heron Air, you don't have to four wheel drive, or tramp for hours and hours; you can simply step onto the plane to view this absolutely spectacular landscape!

Highland Games Coming Soon...



Patrick Hellier, New Zealand's highest achieving Highland Games Heavy athlete, has been named Chieftain for the 2018 Hororata Highland Games.

Patrick has been involved in Highland Games since 1988 as an athlete in the Heavy Events, tossing cabers and other feats of strength and skills that the Scots devised for their men. During this time, he has won the New Zealand Championship, held at Waipu, 18 times which lead to him representing New Zealand in overseas championships. He has competed in games and gatherings in Finland, USA, Australia, Malaysia, Canada and of course Scotland. Basically, anywhere that the Scots emigrated to there are games.

"It is an absolute honour to have been invited to be Chieftain of the Hororata Highland Games. I first competed at Hororata in 2011, and I still have the 'rock' trophy I was presented as champion that year," said 2018 Chieftain Patrick Hellier. "The games at

Hororata have held true to the traditional spirit of Highland Games as a gathering of the clans. People from all walks of life come to experience the Scottish culture of dancing, listening to the bagpipes, athletics, eating traditional foods and of course the water of life; whisky."

Highland Games accomplishments. Patrick has also competed and coached at the top level for athletics. He is 13 times New Zealand Track and Field Champion Over Shot Put, Discus and Hammer events; has been Throws Coach for the New Zealand Commonwealth Youth Team, and Throws Coach for the Cook Islands Olympic Team. Patrick is the head judge of the Hororata Highland Games Gough CAT Heavy Events and has been instrumental in growing this sport in New Zealand. His day job for the last 14 years has been to serve as a Police Officer with the New Zealand Police.

"From an athlete's point of view, the Hororata Community Trust has always been open-minded and very supportive of the traditional heavy events. Hororata is a bucket list event for many athletes from around the world, but just as importantly it is inspiring people to have a go and take part in the sport, right from primary school age to adults. The amateur field has grown and seen a number of athletes step up to the open division, compete overseas and win Championships."

"I am looking forward to being part of the Hororata Highland Games in the Chieftain role. It will be the first time I will be able to spend time out of the heavy's arena, although I will still be involved with judging and the athletes. We have a good crew of volunteers in the arena, including my wife Kirsten Hellier, so I am sure it will run smoothly as ever," concluded Patrick.

Patrick joins a prestigious list of Hororata Highland Games Chieftains. Following Amy Adams who was the first female Chieftain in 2017; past Chieftains include Simon Dallow (2011), Gerry Brownlee (2012), Governor General Sir Jerry Mateparae (2013) and Sir Bob Parker (2014). 2015 saw the events first international Chieftain, Alex Bruce, Director of Adelphi Distillery, Scotland and in 2016 bagpipe rock star Kyle Warren travelled from Australia.

All past Chieftains have remained in touch with the Games and a number return each year. Amy Adams, Gerry Brownlee and Kyle Warren all plan to attend the event this year.

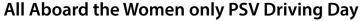

There was an unfortunate accident during the second division saddle bronc event, a horse went down when the saddle slipped and it became entangled in the girth. Local Vet, Steve Williams, and the two dedicated animal welfare officers from NZRA, were straight in to check the horse out, it was sedated and carefully carried out of the arena but sadly, it later died.

When NZ Rodeo Cowboys Association president Lyal Cocks was asked for comment about the "regrettable" accident in the arena at Methven, he said, "I've been involved in rodeo, off and on, for more than 40 years and I've never seen this happen before," he continued, "we will investigate the accident and if there's anything to be learned from it, the investigation will reveal that."

It was so sad and you could tell the organisers and competitors were greatly affected by it and the care and attention the horse received was amazing.

Despite this accident, no other animal or person was injured during the day.

The afternoon events continued, champions were rewarded and spot prizes given to brave young women willing to have a go at line dancing in front of the mass of spectators. Congratulations to Miss Belgium who was closest to meeting the brief and Miss Australia who was the most enthusiastic!

An important part of the day, was raising money for Rural Suicide Prevention. Something close to the hearts of the Rodeo community, having lost one of their own.

By the end of the day, young families and the er... slightly older people were ready for home, whilst the young'uns partied on as is traditional on Rodeo Day.

Thank you to the Methven Rodeo Club and NZRA for another great event!

A great crowd enjoyed the highs and lows of the events, most of the steers and calves making it to the end of the arena without being lassoed. The majority of the riders were given the heave-ho in the first couple of seconds but there was some fantastic riding, the cowboys showing great skill in their technique and style in order to gain points, because "its not all about who can hang on the longest!"

Two Judges, each award up to 25 points for the way the animal bucks and up to 25 points for the way the contestant rides it, making a total possible score of 100 points for each ride.

Generally, an animal is assessed on its "degree of difficulty." An animal with very athletic action and variations in pattern and style, coupled with weight speed and power, will test the best of any contestant.

While saddle and bareback broncs may have similar bucking characteristics, riding styles and equipment determine very different scoring elements between both of these events, whilst bull riding again has very separate elements. In all riding events, the contestant is scored on control, timing, balance, and the technical requirements of each event.

If the Judges consider the animal didn't perform well enough, not giving the rider a fair crack at the competition, they then have the discretion to award the contestant a 're-ride' which means he gets another ride on a different animal.*

I am always taken aback by the beauty of the beasts at equine and rodeo events, my favourite horses are the white or grey dappled in colour, I have no idea what breed they are, but all the horses are full of grace and power with flowing manes and tails. Even the bulls are to be admired, brimming with vitality, arrogance and defiance. It is certainly a sport for the brave of heart.

There are two great athletes in every 8-second ride, the bull rider and THE BULL

Helping Kiwi businesses Innovate

Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern and Research, Science and Innovation Minister Megan Woods recently announced the Government's new Research and Development tax incentive.

This initiative helps businesses to expand their investment in research and development through a 15% tax incentive, which will be available from the next tax year. The incentive will lift the amount businesses – from startups to established businesses – spend on research and development. This investment will help grow our economy by encouraging our businesses to expand their horizons into new products and new industries.

Around 2,000 Kiwi businesses will benefit from the incentive. In Methven, this will result in new jobs and new ways of working. The new incentive was designed based on consultation with businesses of all sizes about what they need to help them invest in innovation. We're delivering a user-friendly, fit-for-purpose scheme that will support a wide range of businesses to undertake more research and development. The incentive is part of the Government's wider economic plan to help improve the lives of New Zealanders through better productivity, better sustainability,

and growth that's shared fairly across the community.

While we have a strong budget surplus and broad-based growth across the economy, New Zealand's spending on research and development continues to lag behind the rest of the world, the OECD average level or research and development spending is 2.4% of GDP; in New Zealand we only spend around 1.4% of GDP. In order to grow and share New Zealand's prosperity more fairly, the coalition government has committed to working with businesses to lift research and development investments to 2% of GDP by 2027.

In Budget 2018, we set aside \$1 billion over the next four years to support businesses to invest more in their research and development activity, getting get us closer to the international average, and also to attract innovative international firms to New Zealand. It is clear that we can't continue to rely on an economy built on population growth, an overheated housing market and the export of raw commodities. That approach has led to the gap between rich and poor widening, our regions being neglected, and too many people being left behind.

This government is turning that around by investing in new facilities to help our regions grow, our family income package that helps 384,000 modest and middle income families to buy the things they need – mainly from Kiwi businesses, and now a tax incentive to help those same businesses stay ahead of the international competition. This is just one part of our plan to build an economy that is growing and working for all of us. We will continue to deliver for businesses, as well as easing the financial pressures on Kiwi families, to encourage innovation, productivity and build a skilled workforce.

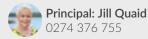

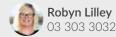

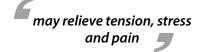


Soothing Hands

Osteoporosis and Exercise





Last year I wrote about Osteoporosis and considerations like diet, supplements and risk factors. It is such an important, preventable condition that I thought I would follow up on the best exercise to prevent it.

Bone thinning is common as we age and can lead to fractures- particularly of the spine and hips. These lead to pain, loss of independence, disability and reduced life expectancy. Specific exercise can help prevent and improve all stages of osteoporosis- to promote bone strength, slow disease progression and ease the pain of fractures themselves. The following are the ideal exercises for your bone density. If you have thin bones or are experiencing fractures it would be best to have a modified programme tailored to your needs by an experienced physiotherapist.

- · Stay active and sit less. Any increase in physical activity will be helpful. Regular walking and cycling may reduce fracture risk by over 20 %.
- · Promote bone strength with progressive weight training. Ideally from moderate to high intensity, increasing the load at intervals to muscle fatique.
- Bone strengthening can be location specific so separate exercises for the hips, wrist and spine can reduce fracture risk.

- · Impact exercise like jumping, skipping and ball games.
- Balance exercises to prevent falls.
- · Spinal muscle endurance and strengthening to help with upright posture.
- · Advice on lifting and moving may help prevent spinal fractures.

You should be aware that the walking guidelines I wrote about a couple of weeks ago; two and a half hours a week of moderate intensity activity- are the minimum for cardiovascular and mental health- they are not necessarily meeting the best exercise advice for your bones.

Risk factors for osteoporosis include a family history, fractures, smoking or more than recommended alcohol intake, low calcium in the diet, post menopause and low levels of physical activity. 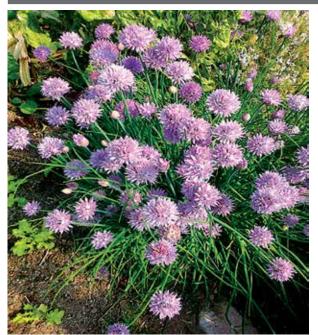

National Gardening Week was held last week.

It's a good time to reflect on the benefits that gardening can bring – fresh home-grown vegies, exercise, time outside in the fresh air and sunshine, connecting with the natural world and getting our hands dirty. Gardening parents (and grandparents) are great role models to their kids and fostering any activity that gets kids outdoors and away from screens, is a great thing.

Growing plants that benefit insects is an important part of

gardening too. Apparently last year was a poor year for the Monarch butterflies which rely on Swan plants for their major food supply. This year, Kiwis are being asked to plant butterfly friendly plants to help feed the caterpillars when they hatch in spring and summer. Swan plants are the preferred food of Monarch butterflies – I've never grown them before but I intend to get some this week.

There's lots of other plants that can be grown in amongst the vegies to help beneficial insects flourish. Some of my favourites are alyssum, herbs such as chives and members of the carrot family such as wild carrot, parsley, coriander and dill. These plants have

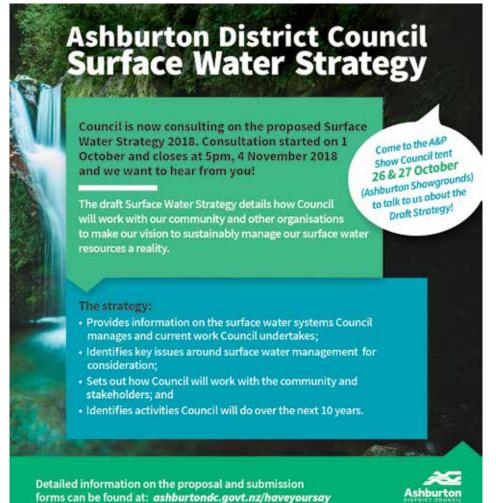
tiny flowers which are small enough for many beneficial insects to be able to feed from. They flower for a long time and can withstand the ups and downs of our weather and they also look nice in the vege garden. Perennial plants to grow outside the vege patch but nearby that are good bees include japonica, lavender and hebes.

Bees play an essential role as pollinators in the garden and are lovely to watch foraging on flowering plants and vegetables. At the moment there are lots of bees enjoying rocket plants that are in flower – this shows it's important to leave some veges that may be past their best.

Mixing flowering plants in amongst your vegies also helps ensure that there are enough bees around to pollinate those vegies that need cross-pollination, such as pumpkins and broad beans.

Growing a wide variety of vegies is good too – different vegies flower at different times, which helps the bees and helps the pollination.

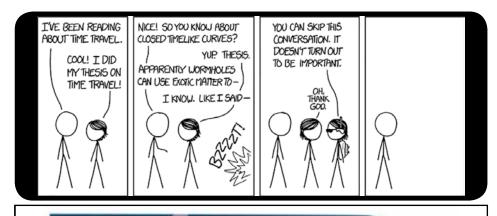

Second: T Inwood, T Caldwell, R Petrie, J Moffatt

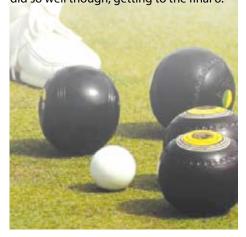
