Johan wins at boxing's Golden Glove

Fifteen year old Mount Hutt College student Johan Struwig is punching above his weight and has just won the 70kg Junior Novice Title at the South island Golden Gloves Boxing tournament held in Richmond, Nelson over Labour Weekend!

Eight months ago he joined Mid Canterbury Boxing Academy (MCBA) in Ashburton and has been under the tutelage of Coach Cornelius Grobler and Assistant Coach Don Sauer.

He has a friend who had started martial arts to gain confidence and felt he needed to do the same, so joined the MCBA.

Johan entered his first competition after only three months of competition training.

"Boxing is about discipline and commitment," he says. That discipline and commitment is taught and encouraged for members to adhere to in all aspects of their boxing, and has a flow on effect into other facets of their lives.

Respect, responsibility, compassion, consideration, kindness, duty, obedience, honesty and truthfulness are tenets that members are always working towards.

There is n a limited amount of people fighting in the 70kg weight range in the South Island. "If you get knocked out, you have to stand down for six weeks," says Dad Pieter, "it's reassuring that despite being a combat sport, there are doctors on hand to check each level of the game." As Parents, Peter and Selma are impressed with how the MCBA works. It's not just about boxing, but about core values that coaches want to give to the kids.

"Thanks to my coach, who has enabled me to grow in the sport and thanks to the Academy," says Johan, "it forms a brotherhood – all of my team were cheering me on at the competition. Cornelius has taught me how to be a good sportsman."

"Top boxers from around the South Island take part in this competition, so it was a tremendous achievement to win a Golden gloves Title. It is a deserving win as Johan trains hard and has a huge future in boxing," said Don.



Ella Quinn and Penny Redfern from Methven Primary School and Penny Nell, Megan Rutter and Sammie Mackie from Mount Hutt College came to speak to the girls about how to be a good friend.

The student leaders helped with games and role plays with the girls to help them learn about how to be a good friend, and also how to support people who are being bullied. A new term which was introduced was how to be an "upstander." An upstander is someone who recognises when something is wrong and acts to make it right. When an upstander sees or hears about someone being bullied, they speak up. Being an upstander is being a hero; we are standing up for what is right and doing our best to help support and protect someone who is being hurt.In many ways, this is another word for being socially responsible. A bystander is someone who witnesses bullying, but does nothing to try and

stop it. Most young bystanders do not act maliciously, but are simply unaware of their ability to help.



The acronym also provides a common language that children and the adults around them can use to talk about and respond to problems.

Penny, Megan and Sammie led the girls in a kindness circle - where you receive a compliment, say one thing positive about yourself and give a compliment to another girl. They talked about how it made you feel warm inside when someone said something good about you. Sammie also said that it is really important to remember to say good things to yourself, especially with there being so much feedback in the media/social media today about how you "should" be. There was much laughter as the MHC leaders taught the girls to do trust falls, (where they close their eyes and fall backwards for a partner to catch them). Then all of the leaders helped them with role playing being good friends. To end the session, each of the girls made warm fuzzies (notes), to give to people at home or school.

"All of the student leaders were outstanding," Pippins and Brownies co-leader Donna Lill said, "they showed initiative in suggesting and leading games that would help the girls understand how they could be a good friend to someone else. They engaged with the girls in each of the activities, discussing and supporting them to practice the strategies they were learning."

Last Thursday the Mahuri team held a Spooky Disco for year 1-3 MPS students, to celebrate our year together so far.


This was held at the Mount Hutt College Hall. There were amazing dance moves happening throughout the night. We played

More options for care around the clock in Mid Canterbury

Ensuring people and their whānau can get care when and where they need it is a top priority for local general practice teams and the wider health care community in Ashburton.

Dr Sue Fowlie, Clinical Director of the Rakaia Medical Practice and member of the Canterbury Clinical Network Alliance Leadership Team, says the community can access care in a variety of ways, with the general practice team that best fits their needs.

"Health providers across the Mid Canterbury region have worked together with their community to ensure that it's easy for patients to enrol with a new practice or transfer between practices," says Sue. When a person contacts a practice to enrol, but the practice is full, they will be helped to find another general practice team that suits their needs. "If a practice isn't taking new patients, it will be in the best interest of everyone, as it's not safe for a practice to have too many patients to care for. But, there will always be another option, which can be worked out with the patient. It is your right to change GPs or Practices for any reason, and patients shouldn't feel uncomfortable about doing this. GPs just want to know that people are getting the care they need and won't be

offended if you transfer to another doctor. It's all about the patient feeling comfortable and not delaying their care."

Many practices are now offering appointments by telephone and/or video, as often patients don't actually need to be on site.

When patients contact their practice they are offered the options that best suits their need. For example if it's just a prescription that is required often it can be sent straight to the pharmacy; if you have COVID-19 symptoms precautions can be put in place, such as PPE and meeting you at a different entrance, or other issues can safely be checked via a video or phone consult.

"The response to the variety of ways you can receive care has been overwhelmingly positive, as it means patients can save time as they don't always need to travel and take time away from work and their whānau."

Care is always available around the clock and if people need health advice, all they need to do is ring their general practice team and their call will be answered 24/7.

"Sometimes the call may take a little while to answer, but stay on the line. Some practices have extended hours, so if you call late in the day, you may be able to talk to your own practice team. Otherwise it will be diverted and answered by a health professional who will offer advice and suggest where to get care if appropriate."

For further information people should contact a local general practice, who will be able to offer advice and answer their questions.

The process supporting patients to transfer and enrol with general practices in Mid Canterbury has been created through the Ashburton SLA – a group of health professionals, people working in health related services and people who use health services that work together, to ensure the local community has access to appropriate and sustainable health services.





GROW YOUR OWN

Seed tape - what is it all about?





Seed tape is a new-fangled approach to veg gardening. What is it all about? Seed tape is a simple idea - seeds of common vegetable varieties are sold in the form of a strip of tape that has the seeds attached.

All you do is cultivate the soil and bury the tape in your garden bed. Tape has the advantage of the seed being at the right spacing and it is a lot less fiddly than sowing individual seeds, and the tape holds moisture around the seeds while they are germinating. For young children and those with arthritis who may have difficulty handling small seeds, they are great, for those who like vege gardening to be quick and simple, seed tape

The disadvantages of seed tape are that it is more expensive than seeds and birds tend to scratch it up unless it is well anchored, and you can't get unusual varieties. You also have to be careful not to bury too deeply, but that is the case with normal seed sowing too. I don't use it myself as I like the whole gettingyour-hands-dirty experience, but I can see it has its place.

Seed tape can be made at home and making it is a great activity for kids. It would make great Christmas presents. The following instructions were from the Diamond Harbour School.

Materials needed: toilet paper, seeds like carrot, lettuce or radish, flour and water, paint brush, cardboard or paper for labels, string, scissors, lollipop sticks.

What to do:

- Cut some toilet paper to about 1 metre long. Then cut it in half long ways.
- Mix the flour and water together in a bowl, until it makes a sticky paste. Make sure it is not super thick.
- Dab small amount of flour paste in the middle of the paper. Use a lollipop stick to make sure the glue is placed evenly
- Get two seeds and carefully place them in the flour paste. Continue doing this until you reach the end of the toilet
- Fold the toilet paper in half lengthways to cover the seeds inside the paper.
- Roll the finished seed tape up and tie together with a length of string.
- Next make a label from scrap paper or cardboard, with the names of the seeds inside.

Working Dog Study published

Working dogs are an essential part of a sheep and beef farming operation.

Vetlife partnered with Massey University to conduct a working dog study in New Zealand which collected data on feeding, housing, general health practices, training and condition, disease and injury, career duration and risk factors for disease, injury and end of career. No other study to date has included this information and it is hoped that the findings will help to improve the health and wellbeing of working dogs.

The TeamMate study was conducted for just over four years and involved 641 working farm dogs (based in Otago and Canterbury) and 126 owners. All working dogs aged over 18 months and in full work were enrolled. The average age at enrolment was 4 years, with the makeup of dogs approximately 50% heading dogs and 50% Huntaways with the gender split also approximately 50/50. Two research papers have now been written on the data collected from this study.

"TeamMate: A Longitudinal Study of New Zealand Working Farm Dogs. II. Occurrence of Musculoskeletal Abnormalities" was published on the 16th of October 2020. This dataset included 323 working dogs in the TeamMate study who were free of musculoskeletal abnormalities on enrolment in the study and were present for at least one follow-

uр examination. The study found that there is a high incidence rate of recorded musculoskeletal abnormalities in working dogs. It discovered that there was no major difference in injury numbers based on gender or breed of dog.

Lead study veterinarian Dr Lori Linney said: "The TeamMate study has shown that

working dogs are vulnerable to contracting a musculoskeletal injury or illness. The average working dog career lasts until age 7 and early retirement can occur due to injury. We recommend that working dog owners take steps to prevent the onset and severity of these injuries, to help prolong their working dogs' career."

"These include preventing dogs jumping from heights where possible, build up your

dog's strength over time when they are young, allow for warm up and cool down for their muscles (like a human athlete), keep them warm in winter to reduce excess energy being redirected from healing and recovery to keeping warm, ensure they are fed good nutrition, give them periods of rest and take them to the vet if they show signs of pain or at least 12-monthly for a check-up."

"Even if they do show signs of musculoskeletal injury or disease, there are many things your



veterinarian can do to make them more comfortable and keep working. We also recommend that owner take care when buying working dogs that they consider conformation and existing conditions that may limit their working future. A dog should be carefully examined before purchase." Dr Linney concluded.

The original research paper "TeamMate: a longitudinal study of New Zealand working farm dogs. I. Methods, population characteristics and health on enrolment" was published on the 17th of February 2020. This study presented the findings regarding the 641 working dogs enrolled.

Veterinarians gave the enrolled dogs physical examinations at approximately 6-monthly intervals. Clinical abnormalities were found in 74% of dogs enrolled. As working dogs are athletic and lean, they are likely to be prone to injuries due to the nature of their work. The most common abnormalities were musculoskeletal system (43%) including arthritis, skin (including scars and callouses; 42%), and oral cavity (including worn and broken teeth; 35%).

Other interesting findings that came out of the study were that approximately 30% of the TeamMate dogs were allocated a body condition score (BCS) of 3 or less. This highlights that owners should consider a working dog's nutrition needs and the quality of food they receive. Vets can provide advice for owners as feeding needs depend on the metabolism of the dog, the type of work they perform on the farm, their general health and any

other energy demands they have, including temperature regulation requirements and injury recovery.

Another finding was that improving sleeping conditions for working dogs may positively impact their health and wellbeing, as well as their career longevity. The study reported that 86% of dogs were housed in uninsulated kennels, 44% had kennel bedding and 52% were not given a coat at any stage. The recommended housing temperature to house a healthy dog is 20-26°C and temperatures in the South Island regularly drop below 0°C in winter. With low levels of body fat, working dogs are susceptible to cold stress. 16% of dogs studied had some form of pressure callous, caused by lying on hard surfaces.

Whilst vaccination is important for working dog health, only 24% of TeamMate dogs were vaccinated as adults and 45% as puppies. 81% of owners fed dogs commercial biscuits and meat sourced on farm. Farm dogs appear to be highly valued with 33% of enrolled dogs covered by some form of insurance scheme. The average number of dogs per owner was 4, and the average retirement age for a working dog is 7 years.

Vetlife is proud to have contributed to the working dog body of knowledge and are focusing on working dog health for the month of November.
