PUKA RATAKA Tamati Wins Big!

Small communities can be really challenging when you want to branch out, and branching out was what Tamati did. He joined the Methven gym, EA Network Gym in Ashburton, and a gym in Christchurch as well, and committed to classes in each gym.

"My Dad was my taxi driver. He was amazing. He would drive me all the way to Christchurch to do a class, then all the way back down to EA to do another one."

Tamati introduced himself to the owners and managers, and offered his help and support with any odd jobs or work needing doing.

The Christchurch gym was doing some recruitment, and Ben drove Tamati up there. "Maureen Baker was there, (first New Zealand Aerobic Champion)," remembers Tamati. "She and Rae Wood are both strong women who are well thought of in the industry, and here they were mentoring me.

I later found out that Maureen handpicked me from that group of 30 on the recruitment day. I was the happiest boy in the world. Here I was with lots of mature people supporting me, and I felt a really strong sense of community and belonging."

Tamati has been living in Christchurch for the last five years, and is now a group instructor with Les Mills in Christchurch.

Last Friday was the New Zealand Exercise Industry Awards, and it was Tamati who won Exercise New Zealand Group Fitness Instructor of the Year (pre-choreographed section).

"This is a very prestigious award. There were five others in this category. You can imagine how many group instructors there are throughout New Zealand," shared Josephine.

"My main thing in my classes is to create an inclusive space where everyone feels welcomed, because in the world today there is so much out there that makes people feel like they don't belong," says Tamati.

"People ask, "What gets you motivated?" I love being around people and uplifting people. I feel very privileged to be in this position. The whole thing with this award is that I am genuinely grateful for being recognised - it's come as such a shock to me. I am the youngest person to receive this award, (Tamati is 23 years old). I'm on a bit of a high at the moment!"

The five finalists in the ANZ Business of the Year Awards People's Choice in Retail Category have been announced.

Just over 500 votes were cast when the voting period ended on 30 November and the top five (in no particular order) are The Stork Network, Big Al's, Stoked Cycles, Hyundai Mid Canterbury and Garage Gym.

The winner and runner-up in the People's Choice in Retail category will be announced at the awards gala evening on 18 February 2022.

Ashburton District Council is partnering with ANZ and Ri Ra Events to host the inaugural event, which aims to recognise and promote local business excellence. Council Community Services Group Manager Steve Fabish said voting in the People's Choice award had been close and just one vote separated first and second.

"It has been great to see people voting for their favourite business or outlet and it turned out to be as close as it can get. There were 11 businesses in the category and they were a real variety, all with good voting support. We look forward to honouring the finalists and winners of all the different categories at the awards evening next year."

The ANZ Business of the Year Awards also features an award for a future business leader and categories for primary industries, export, tourism, manufacturing, not-for-profit and technology and innovation. A supreme winner will be decided by Ashburton Mayor Neil Brown.

Mayor Brown said the district's business community had dealt with a lot in the past two years.

"Covid has had quite an impact and forced many to rethink how they connect with customers. The majority of our local businesses are small to medium enterprises and they have had to adapt to new and changing circumstances. I'm proud of our whole business community, from those selling coffee to those fixing tractors. As a district, we will emerge from these challenging times in reasonably good shape. All our prospects are intertwined, so supporting our local businesses and services is very important."



Fonterra undertakes risk assessment

As you will be aware, over the past few months there have been a number of changes to New Zealand's response to the COVID pandemic. The Delta variant has entered our country, the use of vaccination as a safety control has become widely available, and the Government has requirements in place based on vaccination status.

We have recently conducted a thorough risk assessment to understand the ongoing risk COVID 19 poses to our people while at work in this environment. This has shown us that COVID 19 continues to be a risk in our workplaces and that vaccination is one of the best tools we have to protect our people from the ongoing spread of the virus.

As such, we have started consultation with all of our New Zealand employees on both the risk assessment, and a proposed COVID 19 vaccination policy. If implemented, it would require that from 1 March 2022 all Fonterra roles across all New Zealand workplaces - including Farm Source stores, offices and operational sites - must be performed by people who are fully vaccinated.

You and your teams form an important part of the wider Farm Source community. It is our intention that, if implemented, the above requirement would apply to contractors, vendors, visitors and other third parties that may be entering a Farm Source Store and any Farm Source or Fonterra workplaces.

The proposal is a draft, and no decisions will be made until consultation with our employees is complete and we have considered all feedback. Once we have a final position (which we anticipate we will reach early in the New Year), we will share the outcome so that you are aware of what it means for your business and engagement with Farm Source, and have time to make any changes needed. In the meantime, please continue to work with your relevant Farm Source contacts. Like you, we remain committed to doing everything we can to keep our people, operations, and communities safe from COVID 19, and would like to thank you for your ongoing support.

The trust's original concept plans focused on a rebuild of the Methven House resthome, but professional advice suggests the addition of independent living options will ensure the entity is financially viable.

Chairperson Janine Holland said the trust had worked hard over the past few months to consult the community to determine what was missing in the complex, and what would make it sustainable.

"Villas and serviced apartments allow people to remain independent, yet have the assurance of adjacent rest home care if and when needed. We are confident of a positive response from locals given the interest shown to date."

Other items reported back at the AGM included the audited accounts, which provide full transparency on how the trust is managing its funds. Copies of the audited accounts can be accessed by emailing **admin@methvencaretrust.co.nz**. A professional fundraiser has also been secured to work with the trust to support conversations with donors who wish to contribute to the project.

The trust was originally gifted 1.5 acres of land off Alma Place to purpose-build a new aged-care facility, and subsequently bought four adjoining sections to future proof the development. Methven House is coming to the end of its useable life and the new facility will provide modern care in a vibrant, attractive part of Methven.

Dear Editor,

While watching TV lately I saw that NZTA are making some speed changes around the country. So I made a call to ask whether or not the 100km speed zone from Racecourse Ave to the Racecourse was being looked at. I was told that this wasn't even being considered until at least 2024 as it wasn't in the budget or had even been brought up.

There have been a few close calls by cars within the 50km area of Methven between Racecourse Ave and Spaxton St, as cars don't slow to 50km before entering town. This is unacceptable. I would like to ask the good people of Methven who use the Walkway, have built or are building a house in the new Camrose or Equus subdivisions, Parents who walk their kids to the Walkway, and users of both the Methven Racecourse and newly built Opuke Thermal Pools to send a short email to: James.Long@nzta.govt.nz and ask that they send somebody for just one hour to monitor the speed of vehicles going in and out of the town in this area.

Lets get this speed zone changed to a more safer speed. Nobody wants to be hit by a vehicle and I'm sure nobody would want any accidents to happen around this small but growing community.

Mark's letter was forwarded to Dan McLaughlin from Methven Community Board, who responds:

We have had this road on the radar for some time. We were giving information that speed limited could not be changed until the entrance to the hot pools was completed. When they started the entrance, we raised our concerns with Council roading team. Then in August we did a presentation to the Ashburton District Road Safety Co-ordinating Committee (ADRSCC). Below you will see the follow-up from John Keenan NZTA. This was also sent to James Long, maybe He does need a couple of hundred emails in his inbox to refresh his memory.

From John Keenan:

I have passed on your community's concerns re the SH77 Methven north end speed limit and the need for a footpath extension from Racecourse Avenue to Holmes Road to our

- Speed Management Programme delivery Project Manager

So they are now all aware of the changes you want made.

Our Senior Safety Engineer James Long has confirmed that subject to design, there is no reason why a footpath could not be constructed here on SH77.

Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency typically don't built and maintain footpaths in peri urban areas such as this and we would be unlikely to obtain funding to do so, but Council could, and would if the speed management changes are made in due course.

James has checked Safety Improvement Programme pipeline and this corridor (SH77) is up for 'speed management' review, but realistically its 3 to 6 years away at best.

He doesn't believe this corridor will be a particularly high priority at this stage and it's also one of our lowest classification state highways. Mega Maps indicates that the collective risk is low-medium, and personal risk is medium, so no 'quick fix' is available in the short term.

We will be able to plan with greater confidence, because our high vaccination rates mean lockdowns are no longer our main line of defence against COVID.

Of course, it's still really important to keep up those key health behaviours like scanning in wherever we go, and wearing face coverings when we're out and about. The vaccine has given us a new, powerful tool against COVID. Across all settings of the new framework, vaccine passes are helping to ensure our communities, workplaces and events stay safe.

Orange, vaccine restrictions like being seated and separated, or limiting the number of people able to enter, are no longer required in many places – if all customers and staff are fully vaccinated. In these settings, vaccine passes add an extra layer of protection for people who can't be vaccinated, like young children.

Thank you to everyone here in the Ashburton District who has stepped up to get the vaccine. It's brilliant that nearly 92% of eligible people in the district have received both doses, and it's great news that the whole country is on track to reach the milestone of 90% fully vaccinated verv soon.

If you don't have a My Vaccine Pass yet, I really encourage you to get yours sorted now to ensure you don't miss out on the things you enjoy. If you're fully vaccinated, you can request your pass by visiting mycovidrecord.nz or by calling 0800 222 478. If you'd like a hand downloading or printing your pass, feel free to get in touch, and our team will be more than happy to help.

Over the past couple of years, people across Mid Canterbury have worked hard to look out for each other. This has allowed us to enter this new phase better placed than many other countries, with fewer hospitalisations and deaths, a strong economy, and one of the highest vaccination rates in the world.

Thank you, again, for keeping each other safe through the pandemic.

Have a happy and safe holiday season, the work you've all put in means we're now able to look forward to another great Mid Canterbury summer, and more opportunities in 2022.

The weather has been uninspiring for gardening, to say the least, but it's not all bad.

The cool tolerant crops, such as potatoes and brassicas, are doing very well. Many gardeners have broccoli, cauli and cabbages all maturing at once... congratulations if you managed to stagger them. Broad beans have also provided bumper crops.

Crops that are not so enthusiastic about the continuous greyness are the heat-loving tomatoes, peppers and basil. Greenhouses need to be well-ventilated to try to keep fungal diseases at bay. Don't water much, or not at all, and just wait till the sun comes out again. Aphids like to lurk on the underneath of leaves and growing tips of basil, in lettuces and on herbs such as dill. It's best not to worry too much about these, just wash the lettuces thoroughly before eating and pick basil regularly - wash well and then make pesto or toss in a salad or scrambled eggs. On very small lettuces or young basil, aphids could be sprayed with a soap spray, neem or pyrethrum, or squash them carefully. Keep an eye out for aphids on tomatoes, the tell-tale sign is a yellowing of the leaves. Look underneath and there may be aphids (squash or spray with neem or pyrethrum early in the

morning before bees are up).

Don't use any stronger pesticide as it is likely to kill beneficial insects.

Stone fruit trees are also susceptible to aphids, which love the underside of cherry and plum trees and make them curl up, which looks a lot like the fungal leaf curl disease. They can be sprayed with the above-mentioned sprays but sometimes it is tricky because the leaf is so curled the spray may not reach the inside area where the aphids are.

There are lots of peaches this year. It was great to get away with few hard frosts (unlike last year) and many trees are loaded, but stone fruit hates high humidity and leaf curl and brown rot can occur. There's little that can be done once the tree is in leaf – preventative copper sprays are best applied when the tree is dormant in winter and spring. If you do see peaches with brown patches, it's best to remove them so the spores don't spread to

other trees and fruit. It's a good lesson in only planting diseaseresistant varieties and keeping the soil and plants healthy.

Whatever the weather dishes out this summer, enjoy your garden. Every year there are good crops and failures, and plenty of veges in between.
