Last Thursday, Methven Primary School held an early ANZAC Service.

Teacher Richard Loten along with student leaders at the school organised an early ANZAC service. It was held separate to ANZAC Day commemorations as this year, ANZAC occurs in the school holidays when many families are away. Richard felt it was important for students to be aware and understand the significance of ANZAC Day and the toll it took on local families. The students gathered with school staff and invited guests beside the Memorial Arch and were led by members of the New Zealand Defence Force, who came to Methven for the special service, into the

school grounds. Hamish Marr addressed those gathered describing how ANZAC Day is one of the most important dates on New Zealand's calendar since 1916. It honours those who lost their lives on the Gallipoli Peninsula (2,800 Kiwis and 8,700 Australians), and those who died in the First World War. It has become a day to acknowledge all Kiwis who serve and have died for ours and other countries. There was a visit from members of the New Zealand Defence Force, speeches, a short service led by Sage Burke, prayers and singing to honour and give respect.

at Mt Hutt College this week

Horticulture and Agriculture Teachers from across New Zealand gathered for their annual conference, "Harvesting Knowledge Aoraki," based at Mt Hutt College (MHC) this week.

Jointly hosted by MHC, Mountainview and Geraldine High Schools, the Horticulture and Agriculture Teachers Association (HATA) Conference consisted of a range of workshops by industry leaders, field trips and sharing knowledge.

Mid Canterbury is well known for its agricultural prowess and Minister for the South Island, Youth and Hunting and Fishing, James Meager was one of the key note speakers.

Hamish Marr spoke from his international role and as a farmer about why New Zealand is a world leader in agriculture, despite our small size and lack of flat land.

"We contribute so much to World Trade. Our low population means we don't consume as much of our product as other countries who are more densely populated than New Zealand," he said. "We are a country of agility. We're agile in our approach." He cited New Zealand biology where sheep graze amongst grape vines, keeping the grass down, decreasing the need for weed spraying, yet naturally fertilising the soil at the same time. In the United States of America, it is common to have bare soil (sprayed out) between rows of hazelnuts, with nothing to restore fertility to the soil.

Conference delegates will visit local industry leaders Rakaia Bulbs, South Pacific Seeds and Marr Farms as part of the event.



At it's official opening, it was unveiled by Hon. A J Stallworthy.








Recycled Project

take care of, give hospitality to, protect, look out for - show respect, generosity and care for others. The stars align with our school motto, Per Ardua Astra, (through adversity







rom one country and the timber milled in another. The house is being built by Oboe Homes which prides itself in moving toward net carbon zero construction, sustainability and building innovative homes that cater for multi-generational living. Including mechanical and massive air systems

zero construction. sustainability building innovative homes that cater for multi-generational living. mechanical passive air systems, this home designed to have freshly filtered air continuously throughout house. The doubleglazed windows come from Poland typical

European style the sashes open fully and in a variety of ways, giving choices for airflow, security and ease of cleaning (even on the second storev).

"New Zealand has the highest rate of asthma in children than anywhere else in the world," said Larry Stenswick, owner of Oboe



Homes, "it's to do with poor quality housing." Larry has worked in a variety of industries holding roles in the NZ Government, Affco and started a medicinal drug company.

The home is designed to be energy efficient with a cosy ambient temperature. Building construction invariably creates waste and leftovers and this is something that Oboe Homes have worked hard to minimise. Insulated wall panels come out of Northern China, made from timber grown in North America and flooring from Germany. They are constructed offsite and transported to site ready to slide onto plates on the floor. In this house, the doors have travelled all the way from Shearmac in Methyen.

"We try to source domestically for plumbing, wiring, building and scaffolding," said Larry.

The concepts behind Oboe Homes are to continually improve and are working to supply low-cost, high performance homes for social housing.

I'm excited to promote some good news for our sheep farmers and the wider wool industry. This week, our Government has changed the procurement rules to ensure NZ wool products are always considered in government funded projects.

From 1 July, all government agencies will be directed to woollen fibre products use insulation, carpets, and acoustic panels in construction and refurbishment of public buildings, wherever practical and appropriate. That means schools, hospitals, and offices will start utilising the best of what our farmers produce. This is a big win for the industry, and it delivers on our Government's commitment to back wool as a natural, sustainable, and proudly Kiwi resource. Wool is not only renewable and biodegradable it also helps improve indoor air quality, regulates humidity, and

dampens noise. It's a

smart, healthy choice,

especially in classrooms

and community spaces.

The move will help create more encourage innovation, and open up new markets for our wool products. It's a vote of confidence in the hard work of rural communities, where wool has long been a way of life. This move will also hopefully inspire private businesses to follow suit.

After some tough years battling synthetic competition and falling prices, the tide is turning. Wool prices are now starting to cover shearing costs, and there's growing interest worldwide in natural fibres. By leveraging government spending, we're helping to build momentum and create new opportunities for our young people to be part of a future where wool matters again. New owners are now in place at Methven's Village Takeaways and the shop has re-opened for business.





A big event for Mt Hutt College students from Years 10 to 13 was held recently as they put their business ideas to the test at Market Day.


