Exciting New Upgrade Annie Jacobs underway at Highbank

Generating electricity since 1945, Highbank Power Station, (owned by Manawa Energy) utilises water from the Rangitata Diversion Race (RDR) and is undergoing a massive, exciting new upgrade.

Silt erosion and damage over the years has necessitated in a major upgrade and a new rotor for the generator being installed at the station. The new rotor is so large (68 tonnes), that it had to be assembled onsite, as it was too large to fit through any of the Power Station's roller doors! Once the works are complete, it will increase the station's generator efficiency and capacity by 8.25GWh (Gigawatt hours) per year - enough to power the equivalent of an extra 1,000 average homes.

With walls as strong as the day it was built, the designer of the station knew what they were doing! It houses a gantry and crane which no doubt has been useful during construction and over the intervening years. It has received an upgrade and been put to work for the refit.

The Highbank Power Scheme includes the Highbank and Montalto Power Stations.

"The previous gear was 80 years or more old and it is usually replaced at 60 years," said



Manawa Energy Plant Engineer Chris Sharpe, who after a safety briefing, kindly took Snowfed through the plant. The works include replacing the 1945 - 27MW (Megawatt) unit with a new 29MW unit.

"The rebuilt unit will be highly resilient and engineered to withstand the high-silt load of water flowing through Highbank," says Todd Mead, Manawa Energy General Manager Generation. "It utilises innovative hard and soft coatings, sacrificial plates, and a streamlined assembly for easier maintenance; ensuring long-term reliability and resilience."

The old turbine was cut out with teams running a 24/7 concrete cutting shift over 2 1/2 months, to remove the 80 tonnes of



concrete casing. Pressure testing jigs and tools have needed to be designed and custom built, so that the spiral casing (base of the turbine), can be checked that nothing is leaking, before the new turbine is enplaced in new concrete.

Planning work for the upgrade started back in 2019 and the outage started in November 2024. In a progressive and innovative move, six pumps utilised by the Barrhill Chertsey Irrigation Scheme (when not needed) have had a modification done so they can be used as turbines during outages. This means that around 5.8 megawatts of generation (enough



to power around 6,000 homes annually) is still occurring while the Power Station Upgrade is progressing.

Manawa Energy Project Manager Natasha Keedwell says the scale of the project is impressive, with more than 5800 components from 112 suppliers arriving at the station.

"It's been like playing Tetris with limited space on the station floor, but the progress has been remarkable," she says. "Over the past months, our teams have logged close to 20,000 hours of site work, often working around the clock."






A happy, festive gathering recently saw friends and family of local lady Jan Dynes celebrating with a special morning tea and camaraderie, marking one year since her miraculous recovery.

attack on Sunday, 7th April, 2024. She managed to ring the doctor herself, although doesn't remember doing that.

"Thank God for Dr Cheryl," she said.

Jan's oxygen status was very low and she was transferred to Ashburton Hospital where the decision was made to place her into an induced coma on a ventilator, for seven days because she was struggling to breathe. There really wasn't a choice to make. It was either that, or her body was going to shut down

It all started with Jan having a severe asthma in the next couple of hours. It was highly traumatic for her family. Daughter Kayla had recently moved to Australia and was about to start seeding. Adult twin daughters Erica and Lucy were both pregnant.

> "I got a phone call at 7am and had to drive four hours to Perth to get a flight back. I thought I was coming back to organise a funeral and clean up the family home," said Kayla.

> Days went by living on a knife edge, with the overhanging, very real threat that Jan would not survive.

"One day we were told she was not good, the next day she would be slightly better. One step forward, two back," said Lucy. If their Mum did come through it, a very long recovery was on the cards with rehabilitation at Burwood Hospital. The decision was made to reduce the coma inducing medication. The doctor had said that they would have to look at turning the machine off by Monday, but on the Sunday Jan showed some signs of movement and coming out of the coma, which she did by the Monday.





Around Day Nine of being in a coma, nursing staff pulled the breathing tube out and incredibly, Jan was able to breathe on her own. The family had been advised by staff that every day in hospital in a coma results in a week at Burwood.

"We were told that when the tube came out that she may well be brain dead."

Jan remembers absolutely nothing of it.

"When I woke up from the coma, all I wanted was a cup of tea! Thankfully I remembered my family," Jan said.

After the tubes were taken out, it was a matter of days and Jan was up and about on a walker.

"When I was in the hospital, they'd say right, we'll ago for a walk or a shower. By the third day, I was able to do it on my own. They said I was a miracle. They thought I'd have to go to Burwood for rehab to learn to walk and talk again, but I didn't," exclaimed Jan.

Within days she was home with daughter Erica and even made it to Methven's ANZAC Commemoration on 25th April! A steady recovery and truckloads of love and care

from family and friends meant that six months later, Jan was back in her own home.

"Thank you to everyone who rallied around and supported us with meals, phone calls and everything. It was amazing," say Jan and

It was a celebratory, joyful occasion a year later, to be with friends and family marking a truly miraculous recovery.

Education Parent Portal

Every Parent wants to see their child thrive at school, to feel confident, supported, and capable. The Government is taking a key step toward making that aspiration a reality with the launch of the new Parent Portal: a free, easy-to-use online resource designed to help families support their child's learning journey.

From feedback, we know parents haven't always had consistent access to curriculum information. This new tool will change that, giving parents clarity, confidence, and practical tools. The Parent Portal provides a clear, year by year guide to what students will be learning in English and Maths under New Zealand's refreshed, knowledge-rich curriculum. It's written in plain language and tailored for families, not education experts, so everyone can feel equipped to engage.

The Portal is available online on the Ministry of Education website (www.education.govt. nz) and includes:

- a simple breakdown of what children are expected to learn at each year level
- activities and resources aligned to the curriculum to help learning continue at home
- videos and guidance on what to expect when a child starts school

- support for structured literacy, including access to decodable books and phonics resources
- practical tips for Parent-Teacher interviews

The portal is available on any device, anytime so Parents can check in, get support, and take action when it suits them. More resources will be added over time, include Math resources, building a rich library to help close achievement gaps and lift learning outcomes across the board. This initiative reflects the Government's broader commitment to raising educational achievement and ensuring every child, in every community, has the opportunity to succeed.

I encourage all parents to get involved and use this resource, and as always provide feedback. Because when parents are supported and informed, children benefit, and we all win.



TIPS FOR Let's Talk About

Like all body signs, experiencing prolonged fatigue isn't normal – it's a sign from the body that something's not quite right.

If you were to rate your overall energy levels out of ten, what would they honestly be? Are you operating at a good 8/10, waking energised and have enough steam to get through the day, or are you struggling to get up, flat lining at a 5/10, having energy crashes after lunch and reaching for things to help you feel more energised (like coffee, sugar or energy drinks?)

Unfortunately the latter is the more common situation for many.

There are many potential causes for fatigue, including:

- virus / post viral fatigue
- insufficient nutrient intake
- dehydration
- lack of quality sleep
- stress
- regular or excessive use of stimulants (caffeine, sugar etc) with depressants (alcohol) which disrupt the body's circadian rhythm

KEEPING HEALTHY Fatigue

- lack of exercise
- lack of enjoyment in life (this is a major one – the mojo has gone out)

It might be helpful to know that living with fatigue is not necessary. There is so much that can be done to help you feel good again and have enough energy and motivation to do the things you love!

Some things that can help:

- · dietary changes to increase nutrient intake
- gut health to increase nutrient absorption
- treating any current infection, or recovery from past infection
- drinking at least 1.5L quality water
- · avoiding stimulants and depressants as much as possible
- exercise daily, even if just a little to start with
- stress management (doing less, saying no, breathing, Yoga, meditation etc)
- reuniting yourself with things you love to do. What used to get your wheels spinning?

Feeling energised is not a luxury – it is our natural state. If we are feeling fatigued, we can listen to the body and give it what it needs to feel great again.


Upgrade underway

EXPLORING OUTSIDE

The weather was perfect at Lake Heron on Sunday for the annual wilding conifer clearing day.

Small teams were assigned to specific areas then the team members fanned out across the tussock grassland, removing trees as they



The most prolific species are Douglas Fir and Pinus contorta, both originating from shelter belts on the farmland neighbouring the conservation area.

Small seedlings, (up to about 30 cm) can usually be pulled out by hand; the bigger ones are easily cut off with loppers or sawn. It's very important to cut below any green needles – if even one green needle is left, the tree can re-grow.



Broom is also an issue. It is harder and more time consuming to deal with because it often has multiple stems, so can't be simply cut off and pasted with herbicide. The method is to cut as much back as possible to get to the base of the plant, then paste the individual shoots.

The wilding day is organised by the Ashburton branch of Forest & Bird. They've been doing this job for many years in order to keep the tussock grassland free of conifers. Without this annual work, the area might look like Lake Pukaki by now - completely choked with conifers. The vistas would be gone, the grassland biodiversity gone, and an immense fire hazard gained.

It's important to have a go at clearing every year; inevitably some are missed and many others germinate. It's going to be a job that needs to be done until the offending adult trees that are shedding the seeds are removed.

Learn to be an EpiPen® lifesaver this Allergy Awareness Week

Would you know how to save a life if you needed to respond to someone having a serious allergic reaction (anaphylaxis)?

Allergy New Zealand is calling on Kiwis to learn how to use an EpiPen® this Allergy Awareness Week (11-17 May). Allergy NZ Chief Executive Mark Dixon said; "We want all Kiwis to feel confident to act in an allergy emergency, just as we would with basic CPR and accessing a defibrillator".

To help, Allergy New Zealand has launched a poster outlining the steps a person needs to take to administer an EpiPen® - and potentially save a life. The poster can be viewed HERE.

Since Pharmac began fully funding EpiPens for people at risk of anaphylaxis in February 2023, more and more people in our communities are now able to carry them.

"With no cost barrier, New Zealanders of all ages and stages of life can now have a pen with them if they need it," Mark said. "Pharmac has recently renewed its funding commitment - a decision we applaud."

"This Allergy Awareness Week, our focus is on educating people on how to use an EpiPen®. By following the actions in our poster, anyone should be able to step in and help someone if they are having a serious allergic reaction and are not able to help themselves. We encourage people to share the poster widely with family, friends, and community networks."

An EpiPen® is a medical device that contains a single, pre-measured dose of adrenaline that will alleviate symptoms for a person experiencing anaphylaxis (the most severe form of allergic reaction) until emergency services arrive. It is designed for quick and easy use by the person themselves, or if they are too unwell, family members, friends, teachers, colleagues, or members of the public.

The steps in the poster outlining how to use an EpiPen® to save a life, include:

- how to identify if someone is experiencing symptoms of anaphylaxis
- how and where to administer the EpiPen®
- actions to take-If possible, lie the person/ child flat; administer the EpiPen®; call 111; say the word "anaphylaxis" to the call taker; and follow their instructions until emergency services arrive.

"An EpiPen® is easily identifiable through its distinctive blue and orange colours at



each end," Mark said. "A really easy way to remember how to administer an EpiPen® is: 'Blue to the sky, orange to the thigh'. If you remove the blue safety cap, put the orange end to the outer mid-thigh and push firmly against the leg for three seconds, the EpiPen® will be triggered and can deliver the dose of adrenaline without you seeing or needing to handle needles."

"We hope we can encourage people to step in and act without fear if they know, or come across, someone who needs this urgent, lifesaving treatment. Knowing how to act, could literally make you a lifesaver. And it's not hard."

Allergy Awareness Week is also an important time for local groups and clubs to check how accessible EpiPens are in their communities. For instance, does your school, fire station, camping ground, Department of Conservation (DoC) hut have an EpiPen®, and are key people trained to use it?
