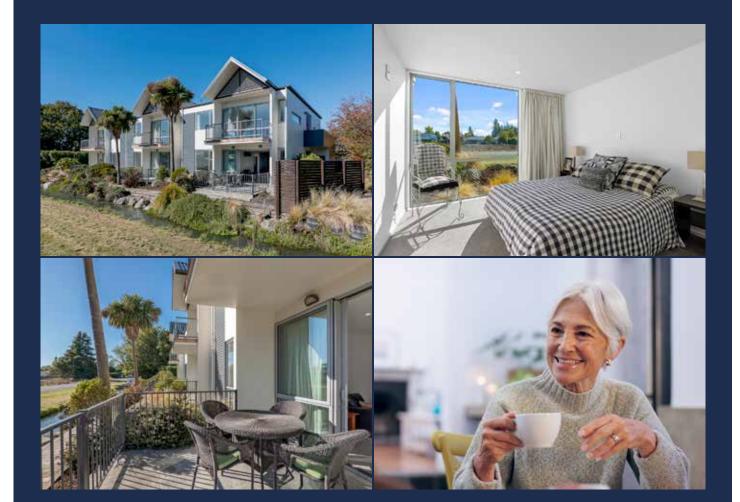

"Grandma has Staples in her Knee"

Methven's local, multi talented teacher Kath Woodley, has written a children's book which is hot off the press.

"Grandma Has Staples in her Knee" is a project that has taken three years to get off the ground.

The book idea came about because Kath is a Grandma. Trying to explain a surgical

operation to her grandchildren, she saw the need for a book that children would love, which would help show and explain what would happen to her when she needed surgery.

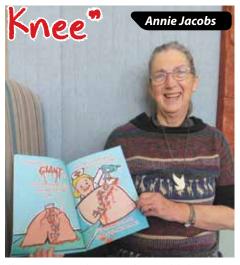
"It took three years to find a publisher as I had to do suggestions that encapsulated my project. The publisher then might ask you to add things or change things," Kath explained about the process.

"My grandchildren were so inquisitive about getting my knee reconstructed."

Kath had reached the stage where she couldn't walk and needed crutches.

"My knee needed to be fixed and it needed to be got right," she said. "For children to be able to understand the process without anxiety then be able to understand where that process is going, is really important. When you say you're going to have staples in your knee - they don't know how to process that. They imagine staples like they might see at school. My grandchildren were really keen to be able to help and show that they loved me."

Kath did the illustrations for the book and the publishers helped with colour and design. Kath wanted the words integrated with the



illustrations, whereas the publisher was wanting them separate. Kath wanted the text to be designed expressively and that is what has been produced.

Already the book is under world-wide distribution and has been purchased in Sweden, Denmark, China and is available through Amazon, Google, Barns and Noble (the largest bookstore in USA). The book is going to be translated and printed in Chinese.

Kath is planning a book launch, details to be advised. And watch this space... another book might be brewing.

Charline off to represent Methven (& NZ) in Masters League Games

One of Methven's own is heading off to represent New Zealand in the Masters League Games in Australia next month.

Charline Dupanloup, the owner of Methven's XM Crossfit gym is going to compete in the Masters League Games in the over 35 age group.

"There will be competitors from Asia, Australia and New Zealand going to compete at the event which will be held at Orange, New South Wales in Australia on 18th-20th October," Charline said.

One month before the Games, the workouts will be released, so competitors have to use the lead up time to prepare for anything.

"We already know there will be running, wall ball and the yoke walk - carrying a pole with heavy weights on each end, across your shoulders. At Crossfit, we need to be prepared for every kind of workout," Charline explained. There will likely be six workouts over the three

Talented, hardworking and committed to Crossfit, Charline is self-funding the trip which will cost \$2,000.

"I will be representing New Zealand, Methven and XM Crossfit," smiled go-getter Charline. It looks like there will be 12 competitors from the South Island and more from the North who will travel to the event.



An online competition was held in March to qualify with some competitors required to do more in May. Charline qualified immediately.

This is Charline's second games. Her first one was held last year in Rotorua where she received a Silver Medal for the whole of New Zealand in her age category.

"I love the atmosphere and seeing people achieve at your level. You're there for the competition but also to compete with yourself. It's great to see over the three days what you've achieved," she said. "Crossfit is a sport for older people - it's not necessarily a sport for people with a younger body. Some Masters League competitors start in their 40's and 50's."

In fact, the World Champion is kiwi woman Pauline Sciascia who competed in the +65 world championship.

Next year, Charline hopes to take a group from Methven with her to compete.

Tracking tunnels now in Methven Walkway

Methven and Foothills Birdsong Initiative are underway with their programme to start making a safe habitat for native birds and wildlife - to have a safe space to live, eliminating predator species in the region.

The appropriate permissions have been granted by Ashburton District Council, trappers have put in the work to become qualified and volunteers have started to put out tracking tunnels in the Methven Walkway.

The long rectangular shaped black plastic tunnels are not a trap, but contain peanut butter (as bait) and an ink pad. This invites small predators such as stoats, ferrets, hedgehogs, rats and mice to travel through to the bait (and they exit out the other end), with their footprints recorded on the ink pad. This information then shows the qualified trappers what predators are in the area and subsequently the appropriate trap is used.

Signage reminds dog walkers that dogs are required to be on a lead or leash in the Walkway and not running free.

The Methven and Foothills Birdsong Initiative will have additional clear signage up when they start trapping (such as in the Thyme Stream section of the Walkway) and will keep traps away from the path as much as possible.

The group are now equipped with some A230 traps thanks to support from the Department of Conservation. These traps which catch mustelids, possums and feral cats, have a chip that reads the chip of a microchipped cat. The trap will not activate if a microchipped cat is nearby.

What can you do to assist? Actively trap predators such as possums, hedgehogs, mice and rats on your property. Local stores stock a great variety of traps. A tasty morsel of peanut butter is very attractive to hedgehogs, mice and rats. Peanut butter or mayonnaise is delicious to possums.

TIPS FOR KEEPING HEALTHY

What exactly is Inflammation?

Inflammation is the immune systems response to fight infection and heal damaged tissue – an incredible process which is vital for health and survival, however sometimes the level of inflammation gets out of hand, and if happening over a long period of time can become problematic as it causes more tissue damage.

You may have experienced signs of local inflammation such as redness, swelling, pain, heat, fever or loss of function, as the white blood cells and other inflammatory chemicals such as cytokines flood the area to help with the healing and recovery.

This process can also happen within the organs and systems of the body in response to tissue damage which can be caused by a variety of factors including infection, an inflammatory diet, alcohol, toxin exposure, stress, obesity, smoking and vaping.

Chronic (long term) inflammation is known to be at the root cause of many disease states such as cardiac disease, auto-immunity, arthritis, diabetes, cancer, liver disease, gastrointestinal issues, mental health concerns. For this reason, understanding causes of inflammation is key to overall health.

Strategies to support a healthy inflammatory response:

• Eat an anti-inflammatory diet, rich in fruits, veg, nuts, wholegrains. Some

foods which are particularly antiinflammatory include salmon, berries, walnuts, avocado, olive oil, ginger, leafy greens, green tea, turmeric and most spices.

- Avoid large amounts of inflammatory foods such as vegetable oils (except extra virgin cold pressed olive oil), sugar, alcohol, refined carbohydrates (white flour based products such as white bread, scones, cakes etc), processed meats, margarine (made with inflammatory vegetable oils).
- Stress management: prioritise life balance / do what you enjoy as much as possible / breathing practices / meditation / yoga / exercise.
- Exercise regularly.

Supplements which can help reduce inflammation (however the cause of the inflammation should be addressed as well):

Quality fish oil / Algae oil if vegetarian - quality is vital, if you get a fishy aftertaste, the oil has gone rancid and

should not be taken.

- Curcumin (from turmeric) a super high dose of this is needed as absorption is very low, so many turmeric based supplements will do very little.
- Magnesium 300mg/day can help with many things including sleep which is vital to inflammatory regulation.
- Multi vitamin including vitamins C, D and E which all have some anti-inflammatory actions.

In summary, a healthy inflammatory response means that our body can identify and heal from infection and tissue damage, without going overboard and causing more damage. Supporting this process is key to disease prevention and treatment.

Our Lady of the Snows School

In this exciting, sticky hands-on experiment, we explored solubility by investigating how sugar dissolves in water. We learnt water acts as the solvent, while sugar is the solute. When the sugar is added to the water, it breaks down into tiny particles, allowing it to mix evenly.

"As we added sugar, we discovered the concept of saturation—the point at which no more sugar can dissolve in the water."

"Each time we add sugar, the temperature gets cooler so the sugar takes longer to dissolve. The colour changes as we add more sugar. We predicted that the covered container would crystallise on the sides and that uncovered container would crystallise on the top with some liquid in the middle. One prediction was correct and the other was wrong. The covered container stayed liquidy and did not crystallise at all." By Lucy and Marivelle

"We started an hour after everyone else but we caught up quite fast. We were on our fifth spoon of sugar and our hands were getting covered in wet sugar. At first the sugar dissolved easily but as time went and we added sugar, it took forever. Our predications for

the covered cup was that it would become slimey, gloopy and watery- and we were right! For cup B which was uncovered, we thought it would go hard and crusty, which it did. So both our predictions were right!" By Elizabete and Tristan

Jake Bailey Visit - Growing Good Humans

Recently we were thrilled to have Jake Bailey visit to speak to all of our students, Jake is an internationally recognised educator on resilience. Jake first caused a global sensation aged 18, when his prize-giving speech as head boy at Christchurch Boys' High School went viral.

A week before this speech, Jake was diagnosed with cancer and given two weeks to live if this went untreated. Jake persevered to give his speech from a wheelchair, the video of which went on to touch the hearts of tens of millions and draw praise from across the globe. Once in remission, Jake's experience left him with questions: what exactly enables people to overcome adversity?

Are we born with these skills, or can you learn them? And if so, what does it take to create people able to not only recover, but to grow from immense setbacks? Following his study in positive psychology, he now shares his knowledge with people all around New Zealand and Australia.

Year 12 student, Estella Lister said, "It was really different than what I expected and gave me a new insight into how I live my life. I think this did not only give us a better way to understand ourselves personally, but to give us a new perspective on how our values are

Jake spoke to the students about the best pathway to a successful life is having and working with your individual values. He asked, "What are your values? Are you living your life in accordance with your core values?"

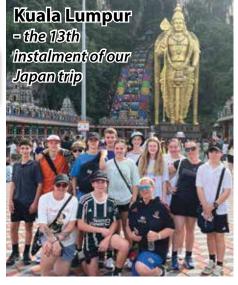

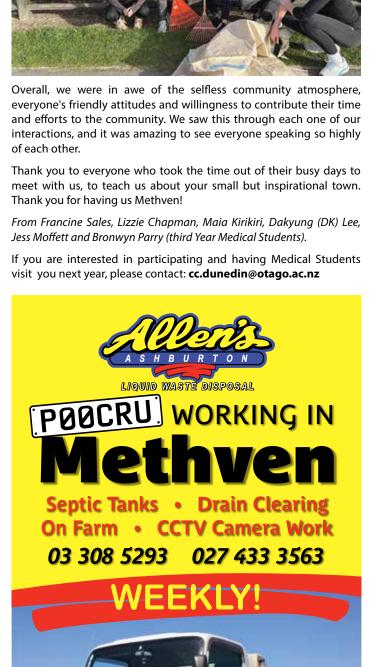

Want to try Qigong?

Local acupuncturist Junco Yoshida is using some of her expertise to bring a new kind of healthy exercise class to Methven and the Foothills communities.

Qigong is new to the district and Junco says she has been seeing a lot of sick or/and injured people in her clinic.

"Some people say they didn't do anything and were injured. However, they often soon realise that their body had been sending messages to them to do something about their body for a long time before the injury, and it is a great part of my work to see that they start to realise that connection," she said.

Qi means a kind of energy and Gong means work. So, Qigong is working with Qi.

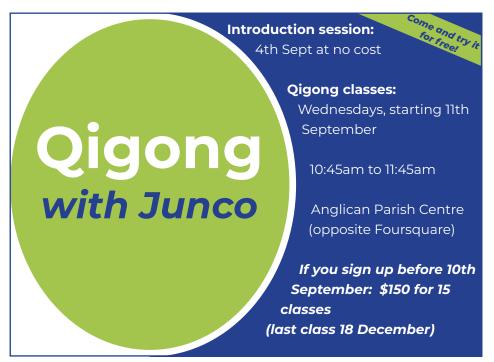
"In the classes, we will learn how to feel Qi, move the Qi and change the Qi by doing Qigong. We'll practise Qigong together!" explained Junco.

In Chinese medicine, it's believed that lack of organ essence causes sickness. For example, not all people get the flu even if they were together in a room. If their organ(s) were deficient, they tend to get sick easier.

"When we take care of ourselves more, we might prevent accidents and sickness. Not only that, we appreciate our own body more (which is your mate till the end of our life), and we won't take it for granted," said Junco. "Let's practise Zhineng Qigong to get healthier and happier."

GROW YOUR OWN

The weather's a mess but mostly warm so we can do more plantings and other brassicas can be planted where leeks grew over the winter. (There's no hurry with this, so if you're still eating your leeks, it's okay to wait on planting brassicas. But leeks will need to be eaten by the end of September, or they'll start to bolt and lose their lovely flavour and texture.) Before planting, add plenty of old manure, compost or fertiliser to replenish the nutrients taken out by the leeks over their long growing season.

Broad beans and garlic can also be planted (but not for much longer). And it's a good time to plant peas – they need some sort of support and it is best to organize this at the time of planting. Climbing snow or sugar snap peas will do well up a trellis or frame, and even dwarf peas are best if they are supported by sticks so they don't slump on the ground. The pea pods are susceptible to mildew if they lie on the ground in wet or humid weather.

September is the month for planting strawberries. Homegrown strawberries have great flavour because they can be left on the plant till they're perfectly ripe (shop bought ones are

often picked early because

they need to be transported). They're very easy to grow at home and if planted now, will be fruiting by Christmas, if not before.

Plants usually fruit



well for two years, so if your strawberry bed is that age it is a good idea to plant out a new patch. They like a sunny spot with fertile well-drained soil. Plant carefully – the growing point of the plant should be at soil level, not too high or the roots won't establish well, and not too deep or it may rot. Before planting, think about bird protection – make the bed the right size so that it is easy to cover, either with hoops and netting or a more permanent frame. Mulch the new plants with pine needles so the fruit will be off the soil surface (to minimise mould).

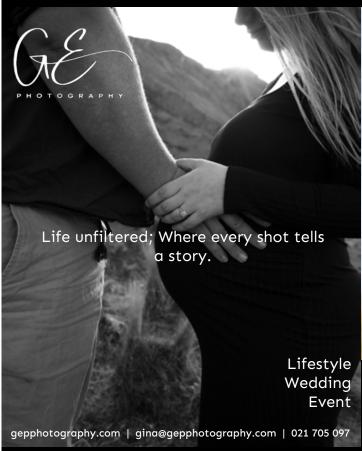
