Lucas would enjoy car rides with his Nan (Jenny Chambers). "She'd have these cool music CD's in her car that were fun to listen to, like "Monster Mash," he recalled.

"One of the meanings of the word Lucas, is "bringer of light." He has brought so much light to our lives," said Cindi. "I feel very proud of him. I didn't need to remind him to practise at all. He always practised, especially later on. It didn't take him long. We could

When settlers were trying to establish farms on the Canterbury Plains and high country, the only way to get stock across major rivers, was for them to swim across, which resulted in precious stock losses.


Dating back to 1848, the Rakaia Gorge Ferry was the equivalent to what the bridge is to us today. It is what European settlers used to cross the Rakaia River before the bridges were built. In the early days, some stock were expected to swim across the raging torrents of the Rakaia as settlers transported their stock from one place to another. A ferryman


was employed to provide the ferry services with a paddock for stock to be held in as they awaited their journey across the river.

In 1863 the ferry service consisted of two punts - one small punt which took two people to row, with horses were swum behind. A larger stock punt which was 30 feet by 9 feet and could hold 30-50 sheep, was wide enough for a dray (a large wheeled cart pulled usually by horse{s}).

The iron bridge was opened in 1882 which resulted in the ferry service closing. The book covers some of the history of local farms, explores journals and diaries, what occurred in the gorge during the war and much more - a fantastic read!

Just in time for Christmas gift buying, Allan has the book on sale for \$70 per copy with proceeds going to Methven Central.



# Riding with the Dirt Dolls

An all inclusive, adventurous group of ladies have started meeting regularly on the lower reaches of Mt Hutt - this is not a mediocre group out for sedentary leisure, but a fun group who love a bit of adrenaline and

"Dirt Dolls" is a bunch of down-to-earth ladies who take each other where they're at and is an initiative of Bike Methven, who ride at the Mt Hutt Bike Park (MHBP).

"It's about getting women out riding and mountain biking," said Dirt Doll Rachael Keenan.

The first week the group met, they had two girls doing an adventure race, so wanted some on-trail experience and practice. That first night, 13 ladies came along. For some women, they want to have a go, but don't know where the trails are, so one (or more) of the group will



ride along with you. There's no pressure to keep up with the group or be at a certain level - Dirt Dolls is for all abilities and is about having fun, connecting with others, fitness and friendship. One person had regularly visited MHBP, but was a bit nervous about getting lost on new trails, so again, others rode along too to explore the new trails

"Its about riding, connecting and having fun," said Dirt Doll Hana Read. "You can come by and try the trails out with others. If you want to go

riding, come riding!"

Last week, there were 20 Dirt Dolls from all over - Methven, Ashburton and Geraldine, who'd come along to

"I like being part of the community that celebrates women biking," said

MHBP has over 40 kms of trails ranging from green (easiest) to black (challenging) and is highly esteemed in the mountain biking world for it's excellent standard of trails. National events have been held there and a number of times the South Island Secondary Schools Mountain Bike Championships have been hosted at the park by Bike Methven.

Some weeks, there will be a shuttle which can transport riders to the top of a trail, so that they are just riding downhill. Others like the push of riding uphill, feeling they then earn the reward of downhill.



# Bus Proposals a Major Impact on Mt Somers Springburn School

Proposed changes to rural bus routes will have a major impact on rural school children and their families at Mt Somers Springburn School.

Of the 88 children attending the school, 65 are bus students and with the Ministry of Education (MOE) proposed cuts, the impact is major.

A community meeting was held recently at the school so that families could get their heads around what the proposals will mean.

As a rough guide, Principal Morgan Platt shared that MOE draw an extended circle around the school and that forms the basis of their rural bus funding which is labelled as assistance (by MOE), with Parents having to work out the rest. That circle does not take into account any topographical or geographical features.

Of great concern was that students may have around three hours on the school bus each day - 1.5 hours morning and evening. Parents are concerned that due to the age of some of the children, they had toilet accidents after 45 minutes due to not being able to hold on any longer. This causes great upset and embarrassment for the child concerned and raises the question; "who is responsible for that?"

Frances Beeston from Rural Women NZ said that as a group they have been advocating for rural school buses across the country, but the rules were set in 1924 and lots has changed.

"Schools are the hub of our rural communities. Healthcare everything we needs to be fit for purpose. Rural needs their own zoning - it is different to urban," she said. "Should charges to the farm owner?"

Morgan said, "The Prime Minister says that National are supporting rural business. They have opened up for immigrants, but only one or none in the family will have a Drivers Licence."

How do those Parents legally get their children to a rural bus stop that may be many kilometres

"Big farms could possibly fund, but what about small farms?" asked Morgan.

Currently the school has three bus routes. The proposal means one route would be dropped, and with changes, going down to two.

As an example, one family would have to travel an additional estimated 440kms per week to have their children on the new route and attending the school.



# **GROW YOUR OWN**

Last week turned on some summer weather, and although it's not to be trusted, it's welcome.

All the usual spring suspects (herbs, lettuce, brassicas, silverbeet, spinach, potatoes, carrots, beetroot, parsnips) can be planted, along with the next round... zucchini, beans, cucumbers, corn, tomatoes, peppers, basil. According to Methven tradition, this lot is usually planted around Show Weekend without too much risk of getting frosted. We

know this is never a given in the Methven and foothills areas, but they are worth a try

beans, etc) are the real stars of the summer garden. Brassicas and lettuce are all very well but they can be grown (or found in the shops), at any time of the year. Beans on the other hand are rarely available to buy and only grow for a short summer season. Their flavour and novelty value are well worth the effort of growing them at home, and they don't take up much space (especially if you grow the climbing varieties. The same goes for tomatoes - there's nothing like the flavour of home-grown. If you only have an outdoor garden (no greenhouse), perhaps stick to the cherry varieties (such as Sweet 100), but if you have a greenhouse or hot area on your porch, go for the "normal" sized ones as well, such as Early Girl. Peppers are another treat, often not ripening till late summer or autumn, but well worth it if you have



room in a hot position. I'm trying some against a north-facing wall.

Zucchinis are easy to grow and prolific, but they do take up a lot of space. Allow two metres between plants, which is a lot, but the intervening space can be utilised by lettuces, or guick-growing (and aptly named) rocket.

Corn is another amazing taste of summer and the flavour is amazing when you pick your own just before a meal. They can be planted guite close together (about 40 cm apart) and are best planted in a block rather than a long row for best pollination. They get quite tall so think of a good position for them - not on the sunny side of a low-growing zucchini perhaps, but by mid to late summer when they have reached their maximum height; lettuces and brassicas won't mind a bit of

When planting seedlings, dig a good sized hole, place the seedling with the roots nice and straight, push back the soil then firm down around the plant to make sure there is complete contact between root and soil. Then water in well, which will help ensure it is well anchored. Same idea with planting seeds – cover well and firm down to make sure here are no pockets of air between seed and soil.

Manaroa was a freak both in looks and nature. He had a high roach back and a tail that looked like a wellused paint brush that was past its best days. In New Zealand, he was cruelly named "The Ugly Duckling" yet in Australia more honourably dubbed, "The People's

Manaroa's biggest problem was his rendition of a cross between the Highland Fling and the Irish Jig at the start. Once underway, his speed was nothing short

of electrifying. The starts he gave away were mind blowing. From winning the Pleasant Point Cup to Interdom heats and placings in every Cup Race, it was just a race for Manaroa. Colin

McLaughlin from Mt Hutt bred and trained Manaroa. His stepson Allan Harrison was his main driver (In New Zealand). His breeding was the purest, he was by Morano from Flying Mile.

McLaughlin had many fine performed horses, but this is about Manaroa and space doesn't permit a full-blown record. A race I will cherish, was the clash between Manaroa and the Australian champion Mount Eden in a 1971 heat of the Interdominion, at Addington. Both the greats were slow away, but they were alone at the finish. This was a joust of two great bar fighters, punch for punch fighting to the post. Manaroa pulled away to win by two lengths. What a race!

For the record, Manaroa in New Zealand had 99 starts, 18 wins, 8 seconds and 5 thirds. In Australia, 39 starts, 20 wins, 7 seconds and 3

He additionally had great success in North America with 71 starts, 14 wins, 10 seconds, 8 thirds. He was 14 years old when he finished racing in the USA, and was still winning - an incredible horse!
