





Mini Mid Canterbury, the district's new mini golf course, is on track to open on Saturday 22 November.

Mayor Liz McMillan said thecourse it was exciting to see the

School students met first with Council's biodiversity officer and the Kanuka Mid Canterbury Regeneration Trust to learn about the plants chosen for the course, and what they would need to grow. The mayor, and former mayor Neil Brown, then joined the students to put the plants in the ground.

"We even had the chance to have a little test run on one of the holes, and that was very entertaining," Mayor Liz said. "This is something that people of all ages will be able to enjoy together."

Mini Mid Canterbury will be officially opened on Friday 21 November and councillors have been invited to take part in an inaugural and social round of mini golf. The course will then receive a final inspection before opening to the public the following day.

If you have your own golf equipment, the course will be free to play on. Putters and balls can also be hired at the EA Networks Centre reception for \$5 per person.

Bookings and equipment rental can be completed online at the EANC website, with bookings opening from next week.

Mayor Liz said the course would be busy and players needed to book online to avoid long gueues. Another unique feature of the course





NEIGHBOURHOOD SUPPORT

As much as I am trying to avoid too much discussion around Christmas it seems there is no avoiding it when it comes to staying safe over the Christmas period.

Statistics show a 33% increase in crimes relating to burglaries and theft at this time of year. So here are some tips for keeping

- If you order items online, have them placed in a spot that cannot be seen from the street or ask for delivery around the back of the property. Leaving parcels in plain view makes it easy for opportunists to walk off with them. Keeping deliveries hidden reduces the risk of theft. A pile of parcels next to the tree can be tempting, when left in plain sight.
- This time of year, please be extra vigilant. If you notice strangers showing unusual interest in a
- property, report it promptly. Last year, observant neighbours contacted me after seeing a man scrutinising two properties across the street. I was able to check with both households one had been away, and the other had multiple parcels left on their doorstep—potentially preventing theft. Your awareness can make a real difference.
- A reputable security company will give honest advice and recommend only what you need. You do not have to spend thousands on equipment that adds no real value. Pay attention to where cameras point as well. One neighbour shared that she now

keeps her toilet and bedroom blinds closed all the time because the camera next door faces directly into her home. A good setup should protect you without intruding on anyone's privacy.

· Close blinds and curtains at night to obstruct a burglars view

Factors that lead to burglary could be financial need, opportunity, thrill seeking and familiarity with an area. Yes, sadly your burglar could live just around the corner. Common characteristics of burglaries/theft behaviour are lack of empathy, familiarity with tools, prior criminal history, and substance abuse issues.

There are a number of factors that make your home a target – accessibility, perceived wealth, lack of security, hidden entry points and signs of absence.

Some good strategies are to set up a What's App Group in your street, block or neighbourhood, set up a Neighbourhood Support group, keep an eye on your neighbours and their properties, talk to Neighbourhood Support about developing these and most of all keep safe!





Springburn School Local Curriculum in Action: Motorbike Safety & Maintenance with **Honda Country Ashburton**

This week our learners had an exciting opportunity to engage with a truly localised learning experience as the team from Honda Country Ashburton visited Mt Somers Springburn School. Their hands-on workshop brought our local curriculum to life, connecting real-world skills with authentic community expertise.

The Honda team explored essential motorbike safety and maintenance with our students sharing practical advice on the safest ways to mount and dismount a bike, the importance of protective gear, and how to keep a bike in top condition. Their clear, confident demonstrations helped empower our young riders with knowledge that supports both safety and responsibility.

One of the highlights of the session was the chance for students to hop onto one of the motorbikes, giving them a close-up look at how everything works and sparking plenty of excitement and curiosity.

Over the last two weeks in Ōpuke M, we have been learning about the "Makey Makey" circuit boards.

First, we had the Year 6 kids come and teach us how to use the technology. Then we got to use it by ourselves!



Some of the group went outside and found some objects. We tested the objects to see if they are conductive: sticks, leaves, apples, flowers, our fingers, tinfoil rocks, and lots of other things are things we tested.



Using the Makey Makey we could play some games on our computers like soccer, make music sounds on a piano, and drawing. Anything that's conductive can work.

One of the cords plugs into the computer, where at the other end it is plugged into the circuit board, which makes the object a touchpad. You can touch the things that are connected to the end of the circuit board to play the game. It becomes like the mouse of your computer.

The tricky bits were to find the right sized crocodile clips, and the easy bits were finding conductive objects to clip in the crocodile's mouth.

GROW YOUR OWN

That was nice rain last week, as well as cooler weather and hot weather!

Lots of spring and summer vege gardens have been planted but there is still time if you haven't got yours in yet.

All summer veges - beans, corn, tomatoes, peppers, etc - are good to go and the sooner they go in the longer the growing season they will have, and the moist soil we have now is ideal for planting. Probably it's getting late for onions (except spring onions) although they will still grow, they'll just be smaller. It's getting late for peas, which don't like it too hot. It's a great time for beans - climbing (also called runner beans) or dwarf. Most beans are annuals (germinate, grow, produce and die a single season) but Scarlet Runner beans are perennial (die down at the end of autumn but re-grow the following spring), so think about a permanent position when planting these. A strong frame is essential - they are very vigorous.

Unless you have a very big garden, I wouldn't get carried away with planting lots of brassicas at this time of year. They take up a lot of room, take a long time to mature and this is peak growing time - ideal for the veges and herbs that only grow in summer - tomatoes and basil, zucchinis, beans, cucumbers and so on.

It's lovely to have some home-grown greenery to add to a salad: some early-planted and quick-growing greens, such as lettuce, and herbs such as rocket and mesclun mixes, are ready now and should be eaten before they bolt. Herbs such as coriander that were sown from seed can be thinned and used like a sprout or microgreen. Even basil planted early in pots can have their tips nipped out and added to salad or sandwich for a lovely blast of summery flavour.

In the greenhouse or in pots, tomatoes are growing rapidly and can have their laterals







removed. These are the little side shoots growing in between the leaf and the stem. If there is plenty of space, two main stems can be left on each plant – so leave one of the laterals to turn into a stem and remove the others.

Tomatoes are very sensitive to herbicides - I have curling tips on some that were about

40m away from weed spraying, and the day seemed still. Hopefully they will recover but may be reduced in vigour and late to fruit. They also react badly to residues in the soil that come from lawns sprayed with a broadleaf herbicide - so don't add treated lawn clippings to compost.

I recently had the pleasure of attending the Sika Show at Mystery Creek, New Zealand's largest hunting and outdoor trade event. It was a fantastic opportunity to connect with hunters and conservationists from across the country.

While there, alongside the Prime Minister Christopher Luxon, we announced the release of draft herd management plans for Sika and Wapiti deer, a significant step forward in hunter-led conservation in New Zealand.

These draft plans support the process propose to designate Sika and Wapiti as New Zealand's first two Herds of Special Interest (HOSI). The goal is simple yet vital: manage deer populations at sustainable levels that enhance recreational hunting values while protecting and improving our native biodiversity and forest health.



Hunting is a cherished tradition for many Kiwi families, and its popularity continues to grow. Recognising Sika and Wapiti as HOSI not only supports this tradition but also presents exciting economic opportunities. It's an opportunity to boost local communities and tourism while ensuring our conservation values are upheld. Hunters are among our greatest conservation allies, and these plans acknowledge the crucial role they play in sustaining healthy ecosystems.

The draft plans outline a range of strategies, including recreational hunting, partnerships with hunter-led



conservation groups, professional deer control, meat recovery, and ecological monitoring. They were developed in collaboration with the Central North Island Sika Foundation and the Fiordland Wapiti Foundation, with support from the Game Animal Council. I want to thank these organisations for their dedication and valuable contributions.

Now, it's over to you. Public submissions are open, and I encourage hunters, conservationists, and all interested Kiwis to have their say. This is your chance to help shape a future where hunting and conservation go hand in hand.
